

Senate Bill 678

Governor's Executive Reorganization Bill

NOTE: SB 678 is comprised of component parts that directly correspond to the Item Nos. found in SJR 66--the Governor's Executive Reorganization Plan. For example, Enactments Nos. 1 and 2 in SB 678 are the statutory revisions required to enact Item No. 1 in SJR 66--elimination of the Commonwealth Competition Council. Enactment No. 3 in SB 678 is the statutory revisions required to enact Item No. 2 in SJR 66-- elimination of the Interagency Dispute Resolution Advisory Council, and so on. The following chart was prepared to facilitate navigation through Senate Bill 678, identifying the relevant enactments (found in the SB 678 in **bold face type**) that correspond to the enumerated items in SJR 66, and specifying the page number and line number where each component part of SB 678 begins.

The bill gives the ABC Board the duty to (i) coordinate substance abuse prevention activities of agencies of the Commonwealth in such program, (ii) review substance abuse prevention program expenditures by agencies of the Commonwealth, and (iii) determine the direction and appropriateness of such expenditures. The Board is to cooperate with federal, state, and local agencies, private and public agencies, interested organizations, and individuals in order to prevent substance abuse within the Commonwealth. The Board must report annually by December 1 of each year to the Governor and the General Assembly on the substance abuse prevention activities of the Commonwealth.	42
