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11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
12	1. That § 54.1-3005 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted, and that the Code of
13	Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 54.1-3012.1 as follows:
14	§ 54.1-3005. Specific powers and duties of Board.
15	In addition to the general powers and duties conferred in this title, the Board shall have the
16	following specific powers and duties:
17	1. To prescribe minimum standards and approve curricula for educational programs preparing persons
18	for licensure or certification under this chapter;
19	2. To approve programs that meet the requirements of this chapter and of the Board;
20	3. To provide consultation service for educational programs as requested;
21	4. To provide for periodic surveys of educational programs;
22	5. To deny or withdraw approval from educational programs for failure to meet prescribed standards;
23	6. To provide consultation regarding nursing practice for institutions and agencies as requested and
24	investigate illegal nursing practices;
25	7. To keep a record of all its proceedings;
26	8. To certify and maintain a registry of all certified nurse aides and to promulgate regulations
27	consistent with federal law and regulation. The Board shall require all schools to demonstrate their
28	compliance with § 54.1-3006.2 upon application for approval or re-approval, during an on-site visit, or
29	in response to a complaint or a report of noncompliance. The Board may impose a fee pursuant to
30	§ 54.1-2401 for any violation thereof. Such regulations may include standards for the authority of
31	licensed practical nurses to teach nurse aides;
32	9. To approve programs that entitle professional nurses to be registered as clinical nurse specialists
33	and to prescribe minimum standards for such programs;
34	10. To maintain a registry of clinical nurse specialists and to promulgate regulations governing
35	clinical nurse specialists;

37	12. To certify and maintain a registry of all certified massage therapists and to promulgate

51	categories of nurses certified, licensed or registered pursuant to § 54.1-3012.1.
52	§ 54.1-3012.1. Nursing workforce information.
53	A. The Board shall collect, store, and make available nursing workforce information regarding the
54	various categories of nurses certified, licensed or registered under the provisions of this chapter. The
55	information to be collected on nurses shall include, but not be limited to: (i) demographic data; (ii)
56	level of education; (iii) employment status; (iv) employment setting such as in a hospital, physician's
57	office, or nursing home; (v) geographic location of employment; (vi) type of nursing position or area of
58	specialty; and (vii) number of hours worked per week. Such information shall be collected and updated
59	biennially, and shall be made available to interested parties only in aggregate form. Information which

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60 could identify individual nurses shall not be released in any form or manner.

61 B. In addition to the fees authorized for licensure and renewal by § 54.1-2400, the Board is 62 authorized to charge an additional fee for every nurse certified, licensed or registered under the 63 provisions of this chapter if necesary to carry out the provisions of this section. Such fee shall not 64 exceed the actual cost to collect, store and make available the nursing workforce data.

65 C. The Board shall promulgate regulations to implement the provisions of this section. Such 66 regulations shall include: (i) the specific number and types of nursing workforce data elements to be 67 collected; (ii) the process by which the information is collected, stored, and made available to interested 68 parties; (iii) provisions to ensure the confidentiality of the data to be collected and to protect the 69 identity of all individuals submitting information; (iv) the amount of any fees that may be charged as 70 provided in subsection B; and (v) other provisions as determined by the Board.

71 2. That the Board of Nursing shall promulgate regulations to implement the provisions of this act

72 within 280 days of enactment.
