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10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That § 10.1-1010 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 10.1-1010. Creation, acceptance and duration.
13	A. A holder may acquire a conservation easement by gift, purchase, devise or bequest.
14	B. No right or duty in favor of or against a holder and no right in favor of a person having a
15	third-party right of enforcement arises under a conservation easement before its acceptance by the holder
16	and a recordation of the acceptance.
17	C. A conservation easement shall be perpetual in duration unless the instrument creating it otherwise
18	provides a specific time. Where an easement is perpetual, the holder shall (i) meet the criteria in
19	§ 10.1-1009, and (ii) have had a principal office in the Commonwealth for at least five years one year.
20	D. An interest in real property in existence at the time a conservation easement is created is not
21	impaired by it unless the owner of the interest is a party to the conservation easement or consents to it
22	in writing.
23	E. No conservation easement shall be valid and enforceable unless the limitations or obligations
24	created thereby conform in all respects to the comprehensive plan at the time the easement in granted
25	for the area in which the real property is located.
26	F. This chapter does not affect the power of the court to modify or terminate a conservation
27	easement in accordance with the principles of law and equity, or in any way limit the power of eminent

27 easement in accordance with the principles of law and equity, or in any way limit the power of eminent
28 domain as possessed by any public body. In any such proceeding the holder of the conservation
29 easement shall be compensated for the value of the easement.

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
