o 9	1. That §§ 18.2-373 and 18.2-391 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted, as follows:
10	§ 18.2-373. Obscene items enumerated.
11	Obscene items shall include:
12	(1) Any obscene book; or
13	(2) Any obscene leaflet, pamphlet, magazine, booklet, picture, painting, bumper sticker, drawing,
14	photograph, film, negative, slide, motion picture, videotape recording; or
15	(3) Any obscene figure, object, article, instrument, novelty device, or recording or transcription used
16	or intended to be used in disseminating any obscene song, ballad, words, or sounds-; or
17 18	(4) Any obscene writing, picture or similar visual representation, or sound recording, stored in an
10 19	electronic or other medium retrievable in a perceivable form. § 18.2-391. Unlawful acts.
20	A. It shall be unlawful for any person knowingly to sell, rent or loan to a juvenile, or to knowingly
21	display for commercial purpose in a manner whereby juveniles may examine and peruse:
22	1. Any picture, photography, drawing, sculpture, motion picture film, electronic file or message
23	containing an image, or similar visual representation or image of a person or portion of the human body
24	which depicts sexually explicit nudity, sexual conduct or sadomasochistic abuse and which is harmful to
25	juveniles, or
26 27	2. Any book, pamphlet, magazine, printed matter however reproduced, electronic file or message containing words, or sound recording which contains any matter enumerated in subdivision 1 of this
2 7 2 8	subsection, or explicit and detailed verbal descriptions or narrative accounts of sexual excitement, sexual
29	conduct or sadomasochistic abuse and which, taken as a whole, is harmful to juveniles.
30	B. It shall be unlawful for any person knowingly to sell to a juvenile an admission ticket or pass, or
31	knowingly to admit a juvenile to premises whereon there is exhibited a motion picture, show or other
32	presentation which, in whole or in part, depicts sexually explicit nudity, sexual conduct or
33	sadomasochistic abuse and which is harmful to juveniles or to exhibit any such motion picture at any
34 25	such premises which are not designed to prevent viewing from any public way of such motion picture
35 36	by juveniles not admitted to any such premises. C. It shall be unlawful for any juvenile falsely to represent to any person mentioned in subsection A
37	or subsection B hereof, or to his agent, that such juvenile is eighteen years of age or older, with the
38	intent to procure any material set forth in subsection A, or with the intent to procure such juvenile's
39	admission to any motion picture, show or other presentation, as set forth in subsection B.
40	D. It shall be unlawful for any person knowingly to make a false representation to any person
41	mentioned in subsection A or subsection B hereof or to his agent, that he is the parent or guardian of
42	any juvenile, or that any juvenile is eighteen years of age, with the intent to procure any material set
43 44	forth in subsection A, or with the intent to procure such juvenile's admission to any motion picture, show or other presentation, as set forth in subsection B.
45	E. Violation of any provision hereof shall constitute a Class 1 misdemeanor.
