## HOUSE BILL NO. 337

A BILL to amend and reenact § 18.2-29 of the Code of Virginia, relating to criminal solicitation; penalty.

## 10 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

11 1. That § 18.2-29 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:

12 § 18.2-29. Criminal solicitation; penalty.

Any person who commands, entreats, or otherwise attempts to persuade another person to commit a felony, shall be guilty of a Class 6 felony. *punished as follows:* 

15 1. If the felony is punishable by a maximum of life imprisonment or a term of years in excess of 16 twenty years, the person who commands, entreats, or otherwise attempts to persuade another person to 17 commit a felony shall be guilty of a Class 4 felony.

18 2. If the felony is punishable by a maximum punishment of twenty years' imprisonment, the person
19 who commands, entreats, or otherwise attempts to persuade another person to commit a felony shall be
20 guilty of a Class 5 felony.

3. If the felony is punishable by a maximum punishment of less than twenty years' imprisonment, the
 person who commands, entreats, or otherwise attempts to persuade another person to commit a felony
 shall be guilty of a Class 6 felony.

Any person age eighteen or older who commands, entreats, or otherwise attempts to persuade another person under age eighteen to commit a felony *punishable by a maximum punishment of less than twenty years' imprisonment*, shall be guilty of a Class 5 felony.

27 2. That the provisions of this act may result in a net increase in periods of imprisonment in state 28 correctional facilities. Pursuant to § 30-19.1:4, the estimated amount of the necessary appropriation

29 is \$0 in FY 2010.
