That § 801-35.1 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: § 8.01-35.1. Effect of release or covenant not to sue in speect to liability and contribution. A. When a release or a covenant not to sue is given in good faith to one of two or more persons liable in tor for the same injury, or the same property damage or the same wrongful death: It shall not discharge any of the other tort-feasors from liability for the injury, property damage or wrongful death unless its terms so provide; but any amount recovered against the other tort-feasors or any one of them shall be reduced by any amount stipulated by the covenant or the release, or in the amount of the consideration paid for it, whichever is the greater. In determining the amount of part of future payment or payments, the court shall consider expert or other evidence as to the present value of the settlement consisting in whole or in part of future payment or payments. A release or covenant not to sue given pursuant to this section shall not be admitted into evidence in the trial of the matter but shall be considered by the court in determining the amount for which judgment shall be entered; and It shall discharge the tort-feasor to whom it is given from all liability for contribution to any other forcer by way of contribution from another tor-feasor whose liability for the injury, property damage or wrongful death is not extinguished by the release or covenant not to sue, nor in respect to any amount paid by the tort-feasor whose liability for the injury.
