9 10	Whereas, Harold Dugan was drafted into the United States Army on February 20, 1968; and
10	Whereas, at the time Harold Dugan entered the armed forces he was a resident of Alexandria, Virginia; and
11	Whereas, on June 1, 1976, Harold Dugan received an honorable discharge from the United States
12	Army; and
14	Whereas, on November 24, 1997, Harold Dugan was informed by the Veterans' Administration of the
15	United States (VA) that he had been issued a 100 percent disability rating; and
16	Whereas, the 100 percent disability rating reached back to an effective date of September 15, 1994;
17	and
18	Whereas, the Virginia War Orphans Education Program (the program) was established to provide
19	educational assistance for children of veterans who meet certain requirements including that each child
20	requesting educational assistance must be no less than sixteen years of age and no more than twenty-five
21 22	years of age; and Whenever, Handle Durgen has four shildren. Christenhan, William, Jamie and Hasthern and
22 23	Whereas, Harold Dugan has four children, Christopher, William, Jamie and Heather; and Whereas, Christopher Dugan, the oldest child, was born on October 25, 1970; and
23 24	Whereas, in December 1997, Christopher Dugan, the oldest son of Harold Dugan, submitted an
25	eligibility application to the Virginia Department of Veterans' Affairs (DVA) which administers the
$\overline{26}$	program; and
27	Whereas, in January 1998, the DVA informed Christopher Dugan that he was not eligible for the
28	program because he was twenty-seven years old at the time the application was submitted; and
29	Whereas, at the time of the September 15, 1994, effective date for Harold Dugan's 100 percent
30	disability status Christopher Dugan was twenty-three years old and would have qualified for eligibility
31	under the program; and
32 33	Whereas, the over-three-year delay in processing of the disability rating resulted in Christopher Dugan being beyond the age of eligibility even though the claim was filed shortly after his father was
33 34	informed by the VA of the rating; and
35	Whereas, Harold Dugan's other three children have received educational assistance from the program;
36	and
37	Whereas, Christopher Dugan has no other means to obtain relief except by action of this body; now,
38	therefore,
39	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
40	1. § 1. That the Director of the Department of Veterans Affairs is hereby directed to examine the
41	eligibility application submitted by Christopher Dugan and determine whether he meets the eligibility
42	requirements, notwithstanding his age. If Christopher Dugan meets the eligibility requirements, the
43 44	Director shall determine the amount of educational assistance he is entitled to pursuant to § 23-7.4:1 A
44 45	[ - The amount of the assistance, if any, shall be allocated from the funds appropriated for the Virginia War Orphans Education Program and paid to Christopher Dugan upon his execution, subject to the
<b>4</b> 6	execution by Christopher Dugan ] of a release of all claims he may have against the Commonwealth or
47	any agency, instrumentality, office, employee or political subdivision in connection with the aforesaid
48	occurrence.
