10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
	1. That § 19.2-165.1 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12 13	§ 19.2-165.1. Payment of medical fees in certain criminal cases.
14	All medical fees involved in the gathering of evidence for all cases involving rape, attempted rape,
15	child molestation, the taking of indecent liberties with children, sodomy, forcible sodomy, incest,
16	inanimate or animate object sexual penetration, sexual battery, marital sexual assault, <i>family abuse</i>
17	resulting in criminal charges, assault and battery on a family or household member, criminal abuse of
18	an adult, criminal neglect of an adult, criminal exploitation of an adult, and aggravated sexual battery,
19	and all medical fees involved in the gathering of evidence for cases involving abuse of children under
20	the age of eighteen including but not limited to aggravated malicious wounding, malicious wounding,
21	felony child abuse, reckless endangerment, cruelty to children, assault and battery, domestic assault and
22	battery, and homicide, shall be paid by the Commonwealth out of the appropriation for criminal charges,
23	provided that any medical evaluation, examination, or service rendered be performed by a physician or
24	facility specifically designated by the attorney for the Commonwealth in the city or county having
25	jurisdiction of such case for such a purpose. If no such physician or facility is reasonably available in
26	such city or county, then the attorney for the Commonwealth may designate a physician or facility
27	located outside and adjacent to such city or county.
28	Where there has been no prior designation of such a physician or facility, medical fees shall be paid

Where there has been no prior designation of such a physician or facility, medical fees shall be paid
out of the appropriation for criminal charges upon authorization by the attorney for the Commonwealth
of the city or county having jurisdiction over the case. Such authorization may be granted prior to or
within forty-eight hours after the medical evaluation, examination, or service rendered.
