9 10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11 12	<b>1. That § 8.01-380 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:</b> § 8.01-380. Dismissal of action by nonsuit.
13	A. A party shall not be allowed to suffer a nonsuit as to any cause of action or claim, or any other
14	party to the proceeding, unless he does so before a motion to strike the evidence has been sustained or
15 16	before the jury retires from the bar or before the action has been submitted to the court for decision. After a nonsuit no new proceeding on the same cause of action or against the same party shall be had in
17	any court other than that in which the nonsuit was taken, unless that court is without jurisdiction, or not
18	a proper venue, or other good cause is shown for proceeding in another court, or when such new
19	proceeding is instituted in a federal court. If after a nonsuit an improper venue is chosen, the court shall
20	not dismiss the matter but shall transfer it to the proper venue upon motion of any party.
21 22	B. Only one nonsuit may be taken to a cause of action or against the same party to the proceeding, as a matter of right, although the court may allow additional nonsuits or coursel may stipulate to
22	as a matter of fight, although the court may allow additional nonsults of courser may supulate to additional nonsults. The court in the event additional nonsults are allowed may The court shall access
