10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11 12	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 23-7.4:5 as follows: § 23-7.4:5. Waiver of tuition and fees for certain individuals.
13	A. The payment of tuition or fees, except fees established for the purpose of paying for course
14	materials, such as laboratory fees, shall be waived for a person who is a bona fide domiciliary of
15	Virginia, as defined in § 23-7.4, and who:
16	1. Has received a high school diploma or a general educational development (GED) certificate and
17	was in foster care or in the custody of the Department of Social Services at the time such diploma or
18 19	certificate was awarded; 2. Is enrolled or has been accepted for enrollment as a full-time student in a degree or certificate
20	program of at least one academic year in length in a public two-year institution of higher education in
$\overline{21}$	the Commonwealth;
22	3. Has not been enrolled in postsecondary education as a full-time student for more than five years;
23	4. Maintains the required grade point average established by the State Board for Community
24 25	Colleges;
25 26	5. Has submitted applications for federal student financial aid programs for which he may be eligible; and
20 27	6. Meets any additional financial need requirements established by the State Board for Community
28	Colleges for the purposes of such waiver.
29	B. The State Board for Community Colleges, in consultation with the State Council of Higher
30	Education and the Department of Social Services, shall establish regulations governing such waivers.
31	The regulations shall include, but shall not be limited to, provisions addressing renewals of waivers;
32 33	financial need; the calculation of waiver amounts, after consideration of any additional financial resources or aid the student may hold; the grade point average required to retain such waiver; and
33 34	procedures for the repayment of tuition and fees for failure to meet the requirements imposed by this
35	section.
