004966832 **HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 193** 1 2 Offered January 24, 2000 3 Requesting the Bureau of Insurance of the State Corporation Commission to study insurance coverage 4 5 6 7 for volunteer firefighters in the Commonwealth. Patron-McClure 8 Referred to Committee on Rules 9 10 WHEREAS, volunteer firefighters provide invaluable services to the citizens of many localities 11 throughout the Commonwealth; and WHEREAS, volunteer firefighters are put at risk of serious illness and injury in the course of their 12 efforts to protect the lives and property of Virginians; and 13 14 WHEREAS, while the Virginia Workers' Compensation Act ensures that certain medical and wage 15 replacement benefits are provided to employees, not all volunteer firefighters are covered as employees; 16 and WHEREAS, § 65.2-101 of the Code of Virginia provides that volunteer firefighters shall be deemed 17 18 employees of the political subdivision in which the principal office of the volunteer fire company is located if the governing body of such political subdivision has adopted a resolution acknowledging such 19 20 volunteer firefighters as employees for the purposes of the Workers' Compensation Act; and 21 WHEREAS, the same section further provides that volunteer firefighters are covered as employees if 22 the volunteer firefighting company elects to be included as an employer under the Workers' 23 Compensation Act; and 24 WHEREAS, volunteer firefighters may also be covered under the Workers' Compensation Act when 25 responding to an incident upon request of the Department of Emergency Services or engaging in firefighting activities under the supervision and control of the Department of Forestry; and 26 27 WHEREAS, many voluntary firefighters may not be covered as employees under the Workers' 28 Compensation Act; and 29 WHEREAS, § 65.2-402 provides that certain respiratory disease, hypertension, heart disease, and 30 cancer that result in death or disability of a volunteer firefighter shall be presumed to be occupational 31 diseases suffered in the line of duty; and 32 WHEREAS, the types and amounts of coverage provided for voluntary firefighters may not be 33 sufficient to protect these volunteers and their families; now, therefore, be it 34 RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Bureau of Insurance of the 35 State Corporation Commission be requested to study insurance coverage for volunteer firefighters in the Commonwealth. The Bureau of Insurance shall specifically examine (i) the extent to which volunteer 36 37 firefighters in the Commonwealth are covered by workers' compensation insurance and other types of 38 insurance, (ii) whether the provision of insurance coverage for volunteer firefighters is affecting the level 39 of participation in volunteer fire departments, and (iii) whether insurance coverages provided for 40 volunteer firemen should extend beyond those provided under current workers' compensation laws. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Bureau of Insurance for this study, 41 42 upon request. The Bureau of Insurance shall complete its work in time to submit its findings and recommendations 43 to the Governor and the 2001 Session of the General Assembly as provided in the procedures of the 44 Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents. 45
