9	WHEREAS, one and one-half million men, women, and children of Armenian descent were victims
10	of the brutal genocide perpetrated by the Turkish Ottoman Empire from 1915 to 1923; and
11	WHEREAS, the Armenian genocide and massacres of the Armenian people have been recognized as
12	an attempt to eliminate all traces of a thriving and noble civilization more than 3,000 years old; and
13	WHEREAS, to this day, revisionists still inexplicably deny the existence of these horrific events; and
14	WHEREAS, modern Turkey continues to deny and distort the facts of the genocide and honors the
15	perpetrators of that crime against humanity as national heroes; and
16	WHEREAS, before the implementation of the Jewish holocaust, in order to encourage his followers,
17 18	Adolph Hitler asked, "Who remembers the Armenians?"; and
10 19	WHEREAS, by consistently remembering and openly condemning the atrocities committed against the Armenians, Virginians are highly sensitive to the need for constant vigilance to prevent similar
20	atrocities in the future; and
2 1	WHEREAS, the Armenian people have not received reparations for their losses; and

23	genocide by educating people about past horrors; and
24	WHEREAS, Armenia is now a free and independent republic, having embraced democracy following
25	nearly 70 years of oppressive Soviet domination; and
26	WHEREAS, Armenian-Americans living in Virginia have greatly enriched the Commonwealth
27	through their leadership in business, agriculture, academia, government, and the arts; now, therefore, be
28 29	it RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring. That the Concerct Assembly designate
29 30	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly designate April 24, 2000, as Virginia Day of Remembrance of the Armenian Genocide of 1915-1923; and, be it
31	RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates transmit copies of this resolution
32	to the Governor of Virginia, the Virginia congressional delegation, and the Armenian National
33	Committee of Virginia for appropriate distribution.
