WHEREAS, in April 1973 the Roanoke Fiddle and Banjo Club began broadcasting live over WSLC Radio and has recorded three record albums and two tapes; and

WHEREAS, for the past 30 years the Roanoke Fiddle and Banjo Club has provided a means for thousands of people of all generations to meet, enjoy family entertainment, and share their love of bluegrass music; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly congratulate the Roanoke Fiddle and Banjo Club upon the club's 30th anniversary; and, be it

RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates prepare a copy of this resolution for presentation to Charles Greer and the Roanoke Fiddle and Banjo Club as an expression of the General Assembly's thanks for 30 years of good times and great music and with best wishes for the Club's next 30 years.
