WHEREAS, following 10-year stint as a film editor and film director, Bob Brown joined the Richmond Times-Dispatch as a staff photographer in 1968 and began covering the General Assembly in 1970; and

WHEREAS, except for one year as director of photography in Charlotte, North Carolina, Bob Brown has photographed the General Assembly for the <u>Times-Dispatch</u> every year since; and

WHEREAS, in 1992, Bob Brown was promoted to senior photographer by the <u>Times-Dispatch</u>; and WHEREAS, honored on numerous occasions in state, regional, and national competitions, Bob Brown has been named three times as Virginia News Photographer of the Year and in 1989 received the MILEY Award from the Virginia News Photography Association; and

WHEREAS, in 1984, the General Assembly was the subject of Bob Brown's <u>Capitol Comics</u>, a humorous look at the Virginia Legislature; and

WHEREAS, for three decades, Bob Brown has provided readers of the <u>Times-Dispatch</u> with accurate, penetrating, artistic, and sometimes less-than-flattering portraits of the General Assembly at work; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly hereby commend Robert Brown on his long and successful career as a photographer for the <u>Richmond Times-Dispatch</u>; and, be it
