WHEREAS, Judy Gulledge has taught with distinction in the Norfolk public schools since 1984; and

WHEREAS, during the course of her career, Judy Gulledge has been honored repeatedly and has received numerous awards, including the prestigious Presidential Award for Excellence in Mathematics and Science Teaching; and

WHEREAS, Judy Gulledge has been intimately involved in the development of the Maritime Pathways Project at Northside Middle School in Norfolk, where the Walker-Heilig Aqua Lab is located; and
