Patrons-Jones, J.C., Christian, Drake, Joannou, Melvin, Moss, Robinson and Williams; Senators: Lambert, Lucas, Marsh, Maxwell and Miller, Y.B. WHEREAS, Dr. H. McDonald Rimple, a member of the Board of Visitors of the Medical College of Hampton Roads, received the U.S. Public Health Service Retired Officers Recognition Award on December 5, 1999; and WHEREAS, the award, established in 1998, recognizes the "outstanding contributions of career officers who have also continued to make significant contributions to the public health subsequent to their retirement"; and WHEREAS, a native of Trinidad, Dr. Rimple graduated from Howard University College of Medicine and joined the Public Health Service in 1957, rising to the rank of assistant surgeon general; and WHEREAS, Dr. Rimple also served as the first director of the National Health Service Corps, which 17 18 provides health care service to medically underserved areas, and, in 1976, was appointed regional health administrator for all federal health programs in six mid-Atlantic states; and 19 20 WHEREAS, in 1984, following his retirement from the Public Health Service, Dr. Rimple was 21 appointed director of the Norfolk Department of Health, the first African-American to hold that post; 22 and 23 WHEREAS, Dr. Rimple was later promoted to medical director of the eastern region of the Virginia 24 Department of Health, in which position he served until his retirement in 1991; and 25 WHEREAS, Dr. Rimple has been previously recognized for his exemplary service to the U.S. Public 26 Health Service, receiving the Commendation Medal, the Meritorious Service Medal, and the Assistant Secretary Award for Exceptional Achievement in Public Health; and 27 28 WHEREAS, Dr. Rimple has also served a wide range of organizations at the local and state levels, 29 including the Governor's Councils on Infant Mortality and Prevention of Alcohol and Substance Abuse, 30 the Center for Pediatric Research, the Chrysler Museum, the Virginia Opera, the March of Dimes, the American Heart Association, and the Action Alliance for Virginia's Children and Youth; now, therefore, 31 32 be it 33 RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly 34 commend and congratulate Dr. H. McDonald Rimple on his prestigious recognition from the U.S. Public 35 Health Service; and, be it

36 RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates prepare a copy of this resolution 37 for presentation to Dr. H. McDonald Rimple as an expression of the General Assembly's appreciation for 38 his lifetime commitment to public health.
