football's elite players; and

WHEREAS, in leading the Hokies to an undefeated regular season, a place in the national
championship game in the Sugar Bowl, and a No. 2 national ranking in the final polls, Micheal Vick
won the hearts of Virginia Tech football fans and captured the attention of the nation; and

WHEREAS, an exciting player blessed with athleticism and amazing grace under pressure, Micheal
 Vick made the play of the 1999 season against West Virginia University to escape what seemed to be
 certain defeat and rescue the Hokies' historic season; and

WHEREAS, following the season, Micheal Vick was named Big East Conference Rookie of the Yearand Offensive Player of the Year, the first player ever to receive both awards in the same year; and

WHEREAS in voting for the prestigious Heisman Trophy, Micheal Vick placed third, the highestfinish ever for a freshman athlete; and

WHEREAS, at the ESPY Awards, sponsored by ESPN, Micheal Vick was named Football Player ofthe Year for 1999; and

WHEREAS, in the harsh glare of national publicity, Micheal Vick has consistently exhibited poise,
 perspective, courtesy, and maturity that belie his relative youth and bring great credit to his family,
 Virginia Tech, and the Commonwealth; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly hereby
 commend and congratulate Micheal Vick on his outstanding performance during the 1999 college
 football season; and, be it

RESOLVED FURTHER, That the General Assembly hereby express its urgent hope that Micheal
Vick give the most serious consideration to completing his full, four-year career at Virginia Tech; and, be it
