WHEREAS, the Internet is a valuable resource in obtaining information regarding education,
ducational technology, and other education-related materials; and
WHEREAS, the Commonwealth already provides access to comprehensive Internet websites on
ducation within the website maintained by the Virginia Information Providers Network Authority
VIPNet), within the website maintained by the Department of Education, and within the website known
s the "Commonwealth of Knowledge"; and
WHEREAS, while these websites offer valuable educational information such as lesson plans,
andards of learning, and other information for teachers, parents, and students, information regarding the
urchase of educational technology equipment and hardware is not always readily available; and
WHEREAS, on occasions a teacher, a parent, or a student may have to search all three websites in
rder to find the information necessary for carrying out his educational pursuits; and
WHEREAS, on December 10, 1999, the Commonwealth merged its two major Internet gateways,
aintained by the Department of Information Technology and VIPNet, into a single web portal, thus
roviding Virginians with a convenient, user-friendly way to access all of the information and services
nat the government provides; now, therefore, be it
RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Virginia Information roviders [Network] Authority be requested to create, as soon as practicable, and maintain a web

Providers [Network] Authority be requested to create, as soon as practicable, and maintain a web 29 portal to serve as a common gateway to a comprehensive source of educational information and 30 services, including information for the procurement of educational technology [compiled from the 31 Department of General Services' central electronic procurement website and other appropriate websites], 32 as it has done for government information and services.

33 All agencies of the Commonwealth shall give assistance to the Authority and VIPNet in carrying out 34 the provisions of this act, upon request. Upon carrying out the provisions of this Act, the Authority and 35 VIPNet shall attempt to notify all interested persons.
