| 10 | Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: |
| 11 | 1. That § 29.1-518 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: |
| 12 | § 29.1-518. When killing of beaver permitted; civil action. |
| 13 | A. When beaver are substantially damaging crops or lands, the owner of the premises, his agent or |
| 14 | tenant, may kill the animals, or have them killed, under a permit obtained from the game warden. |
| 15 | B. Whenever beaver located on one landowner's property are damming a stream or a watercourse or |
| 16 | other body of water so as to divert water flowing onto an adjacent landowner's property, or are |
| 17 | damming a stream or a watercourse or other body of water so as to impound water upon an adjacent |
| 18 | landowner's property, or are otherwise damaging crops, timber, or other property interests of an |
| 19 | adjacent landowner, the adjacent landowner may bring a civil action against the owner of the land |
| 20 | upon which the beaver are located to obtain all injunctive relief, both mandatory and prohibitory. The |
| 21 | injunctive relief may require the landowner upon whose property the beaver are located to permanently |
| 22 | remove all beaver dams diverting water from or impounding water on the adjacent landowner's property |
| 23 | and may require such other relief as is necessary to prevent further interference with the adjacent |
| 24 | landowner's property rights or damage to his crops, timber, or lands. In such civil action, the adjacent |
| 25 | landowner shall further be entitled to compensatory damages together with reasonable attorney's fees |
| 26 | expended in the civil action. |
