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VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

2 An Act to amend and reenact § 15.2-4507 of the Code of Virginia, relating to members of the 3 Transportation District Commission of Hampton Roads.

6 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

7 1. That § 15.2-4507 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 8

§ 15.2-4507. Members of commission.

9 A. The commission shall consist of the number of members the component governments shall from 10 time to time agree upon, or as may otherwise be provided by law. The governing body of each participating county and city shall appoint from among its members the number of commissioners to 11 which the county or city is entitled; however, for those commissions with powers as set forth in 12 subsection A of § 15.2-4515, the governing body of each participating county or city is not limited to 13 appointing commissioners from among its members. In addition, the governing body may appoint from 14 15 its number or otherwise, designated alternate members for those appointed to the commission who shall be able to exercise all of the powers and duties of a commission member when the regular member is 16 17 absent from commission meetings. Each such appointee shall serve at the pleasure of the appointing body; however, no appointee to a commission with powers as set forth in subsection B of \S 15.2-4515 18 19 may continue to serve when he is no longer a member of the appointing body. Each governing body 20 shall inform the commission of its appointments to and removals from the commission by delivering to 21 the commission a certified copy of the resolution making the appointment or causing the removal.

In the case of a transportation district which was established on or after July 1, 1986, and which 22 includes more than one jurisdiction located within the Washington, D.C. metropolitan area, the commission shall also include two members of the House of Delegates and one member of the Senate of 23 24 25 Virginia from legislative districts located wholly or in part within the boundaries of the transportation 26 district. The members of the House of Delegates shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House for 27 terms of two years and the member of the Senate by the Senate Committee on Privileges and Elections 28 for a term of four years; however, the terms of such members shall terminate if they no longer are 29 members of their respective houses. The members of the General Assembly shall be eligible for 30 reappointment so long as they remain members of their respective houses.

31 In the case of the Tidewater Transportation District, the commission shall also include two members 32 of the House of Delegates and one member of the Senate from legislative districts located wholly or in 33 part within the boundaries of the respective transportation districts. The members of the House of 34 Delegates shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House for terms of two years and the member of the 35 Senate shall be appointed by the Senate Committee on Privileges and Elections for a term of four years; however, the terms of such members shall terminate if they no longer are members of their respective 36 37 houses. The members of the General Assembly shall be eligible for reappointment so long as they 38 remain members of their respective houses.

39 In the case of the Peninsula Transportation District Commission of Hampton Roads, the commission 40 may shall also include one member of the House of Delegates or and one member of the Senate, or 41 both, from legislative districts located wholly or in part within the boundaries of the Peninsula 42 Transportation District one of whom shall be a resident of the City of Hampton or the City of Newport 43 News and one of whom shall be a resident of the City of Chesapeake, the City of Norfolk, the City of 44 Suffolk, the City of Portsmouth, or the City of Virginia Beach. The member of the House of Delegates 45 shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House for a term of two years and the member of the Senate shall be appointed by the Senate Committee on Privileges and Elections for a term of four years, upon 46 47 the receipt of a certified copy of a resolution of the commission requesting such appointment, concurred in by the councils of the Cities of Newport News and Hampton by adoption of an appropriate resolution 48 49 by such councils. The terms of such members shall terminate if they no longer are members of their respective houses. The members of the General Assembly shall be eligible for reappointment so long as 50 they remain members of their respective houses and appointments shall be made for any unexpired 51 52 terms.

53 The Chairman of the Commonwealth Transportation Board, or his designee, shall be a member of the 54 commission, ex officio. The chairman of the Commonwealth Transportation Board may appoint an 55 alternate member who may exercise all the powers and duties of the chairman of the Commonwealth 56 Transportation Board when neither the chairman of the Commonwealth Transportation Board nor his

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designee is present at a commission meeting.

B. Any appointed member of a commission of a transportation district which was established prior to July 1, 1986, and which includes jurisdictions located within the Washington, D.C. standard metropolitan statistical area, is authorized to serve as a member of the board of directors of the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority (Chapter 627 of the Acts of Assembly of 1958 as amended) and while so serving the provisions of § 2.1-30 shall not apply to such member.
