2 An Act to amend and reenact §§ 33.1-268, 33.1-269, 33.1-276, 33.1-277, 33.1-278, 33.1-280, and 3 33.1-284 of the Code of Virginia; to amend the Code of Virginia by adding a section numbered 4 33.1-23.03:8; and to authorize the Commonwealth Transportation Board to issue Commonwealth of 5 Virginia Federal Highway Reimbursement Anticipation Notes, relating to funding of priority 6 transportation projects; appropriation.

9 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

10 1. That §§ 33.1-268, 33.1-269, 33.1-276, 33.1-277, 33.1-278, 33.1-280, and 33.1-284 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted and that the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section 11 12 numbered 33.1-23.03:8 as follows:

§ 33.1-23.03:8. Priority Transportation Fund established.

14 A. There is hereby created in the state treasury a special nonreverting fund to be known as the 15 Priority Transportation Fund, hereafter referred to as "the Fund." The Fund shall be established on the books of the Comptroller. Interest earned on moneys in the Fund shall remain in the Fund and be 16 17 credited to it. All funds as may be designated in the appropriation act for deposit to the Fund shall be 18 paid into the state treasury and credited to the Fund. Such funds shall include:

19 1. A portion of the moneys actually collected, including penalty and interest, attributable to any 20 increase in revenues from the taxes imposed under Chapter 22 (§ 58.1-2200 et seq.) of Title 58.1, with such increase being calculated as the difference between such tax revenues collected in the manner 21 22 prescribed under Chapter 22 less such tax revenues that would have been collected using the prescribed 23 manner in effect before the effective date of Chapter 22. The portion to be deposited to the Fund shall 24 be the moneys actually collected from such increase in revenues and allocated for highway and mass 25 transit improvement projects as set forth in § 33.1-23.03:2, but not including any amounts that are 26 allocated to the Commonwealth Port Fund and the Commonwealth Airport Fund under such section. 27 There shall also be deposited into the Fund all additional federal revenues attributable to Chapter 22 28 (§ 58.1-2200 et seq.) of Title 58.1; and

29 2. Beginning with the fiscal year ending June 30, 2000, and for fiscal years thereafter, all revenues 30 that exceed the official forecast, pursuant to § 2.1-393, for (i) the Highway Maintenance and Operating 31 Fund and (ii) the allocation to highway and mass transit improvement projects as set forth in 32 § 33.1-23.03:2, but not including any amounts that are allocated to the Commonwealth Port Fund and 33 the Commonwealth Airport Fund under such section; and 34

3. Any other such funds as may be transferred, allocated, or appropriated.

35 The Fund shall be considered a part of the Transportation Trust Fund. Any moneys remaining in the 36 Fund, including interest thereon, at the end of each fiscal year shall not revert to the general fund but shall remain in the Fund. Moneys in the Fund shall be used solely for the purposes enumerated in 37 38 subsection B of this section. Expenditures and disbursements from the Fund shall be made by the State 39 Treasurer on warrants issued by the Comptroller.

40 B. The Commonwealth Transportation Board shall use the Fund to facilitate the financing of priority 41 transportation projects throughout the Commonwealth. The Board may use the Fund either (i) by expending amounts therein on such projects directly, (ii) by payment to any authority, locality, 42 43 commission or other entity for the purpose of paying the costs thereof, or (iii) by using such amounts to 44 support, secure, or leverage financing for such projects. No expenditures from or other use of amounts 45 in the Fund shall be considered in allocating highway maintenance and construction funds under § 33.1-23.1 or apportioning Transportation Trust Fund funds under § 58.1-638, but shall be in addition 46 thereto. The Board shall use the Fund to facilitate the financing of priority transportation projects as 47 48 designated by the General Assembly; provided, however, that, at the discretion of the Commonwealth Transportation Board, funds allocated to projects within a transportation district may be allocated 49 50 among projects within the same transportation district as needed to meet construction cash-flow needs. 51 § 33.1-268. Definitions.

As used in this article, the following words and terms shall have the following meanings:

53 (1) The word "Board" means the Commonwealth Transportation Board, or if the Commonwealth 54 Transportation Board is abolished, any board, commission or officer succeeding to the principal 55 functions thereof or upon whom the powers given by this article to the Board shall be given by law.

56 (2) The word "project" or "projects" means any one or more of the following: SB33ER2

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57 (a) York River Bridges, extending from a point within the Town of Yorktown in York County, or 58 within York County across the York River to Gloucester Point or some point in Gloucester County.

59 (b) Rappahannock River Bridge, extending from Greys Point, or its vicinity, in Middlesex County, 60 across the Rappahannock River to a point in the vicinity of White Stone, in Lancaster County, or at 61 some other feasible point in the general vicinity of the two respective points. 62

(c), (d) [Reserved.]

63 (e) James River Bridge, from a point at or near Jamestown, in James City County, across the James 64 River to a point in Surry County.

65 (f), (g) [Reserved.]

(h) James River, Chuckatuck and Nansemond River Bridges, together with necessary connecting 66 67 roads, in the Cities of Newport News and Suffolk and the County of Isle of Wight.

68 (i) [Reserved.]

(i) Hampton Roads Bridge, Tunnel, or Bridge and Tunnel System, extending from a point or points 69 70 in the Cities of Newport News and Hampton on the northwest shore of Hampton Roads across Hampton 71 Roads to a point or points in the City of Norfolk or Suffolk on the southeast shore of Hampton Roads.

(k) The Norfolk-Virginia Beach Highway, extending from a point in the vicinity of the intersection 72 73 of Interstate Route 64 and Primary Route 58 at Norfolk to some feasible point between London Bridge 74 and Primary Route 60.

75 (1) The Henrico-James River Bridge, extending from a point on the eastern shore of the James 76 River in Henrico County to a point on the western shore, between Falling Creek and Bells Road 77 interchanges of the Richmond-Petersburg Turnpike; however, the project shall be deemed to include all 78 property, rights, easements and franchises relating to any of the foregoing projects and deemed necessary 79 or convenient for the operation thereof and to include approaches thereto.

80 (m) The limited access highway between the Patrick Henry Airport area and the Newport News downtown area which generally runs parallel to tracks of the Chesapeake and Ohio Railroad. 81

(n) Dulles Access Road outer roadways, extending from a point on Route 7 in Loudoun County in 82 83 an easterly direction to a point east of Route 123 on the Dulles Access Road in Fairfax County. These roadways are to be two or three lanes in each direction constructed adjacent to, and parallel to or 84 extending west from, the Dulles Access Road. 85 86

(o), (p) [Repealed.]

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(q) Subject to the limitations and approvals of § 33.1-279.1, any other highway for a primary 87 88 highway transportation improvement district or transportation service district which the Board has agreed 89 to finance under a contract with any such district or any other alternative mechanism for generation of 90 local revenues for specific funding of a project satisfactory to the Commonwealth Transportation Board, 91 the financing for which is to be secured by Transportation Trust Fund revenues under any appropriation 92 made by the General Assembly for that purpose and payable first from revenues received under such contract or other local funding source, second, to the extent required, from funds appropriated and 93 94 allocated, pursuant to the highway allocation formula as provided by law, to the highway construction 95 district in which the project is located or to the county or counties in which the project is located and third, to the extent required from other legally available revenues of the Trust Fund and from any other 96 97 available source of funds. 98

(r) U.S. 58 Corridor Development Program projects as defined in §§ 33.1-221.1:2 and 58.1-815.

(s) The Northern Virginia Transportation District Program as defined in § 33.1-221.1:3.

100 (t) Any program for highways or mass transit or transportation facilities, endorsed by the local jurisdiction or jurisdictions affected, which agree that certain distributions of state recordation taxes will 101 102 be dedicated and used for the payment of any bonds or other obligations, including interest thereon, the 103 proceeds of which were used to pay the cost of the program. Any such program shall be referred to as a 104 "Transportation Improvement Program."

105 (u) Any project designated from time to time by the General Assembly financed in whole or part through the issuance of Commonwealth of Virginia Federal Highway Reimbursement Anticipation Notes. 106 (3) The word "undertaking" means all of the projects authorized to be acquired or constructed under 107 108 this article.

109 (4) The word "improvements" means such repairs, replacements, additions and betterments of and to 110 a project acquired by purchase or by condemnation as are deemed necessary to place it in a safe and efficient condition for the use of the public, if such repairs, replacements, additions and betterments are 111 ordered prior to the sale of any bonds for the acquisition of such project. 112

(5) The term "cost of project" as applied to a project to be acquired by purchase or by 113 condemnation, includes the purchase price or the amount of the award, cost of improvements, financing 114 115 charges, interest during any period of disuse before completion of improvements, cost of traffic estimates and of engineering and legal expenses, plans, specifications and surveys, estimates of cost and 116 of revenues, other expenses necessary or incident to determining the feasibility or practicability of the 117

118 enterprises, administrative expenses and such other expenses as may be necessary or incident to the 119 financing herein authorized and the acquisition of the project and the placing of the project in operation.

120 (6) The term "cost of project" as applied to a project to be constructed, embraces the cost of 121 construction, the cost of all lands, properties, rights, easements and franchises acquired which are 122 deemed necessary for such construction, the cost of acquiring by purchase or condemnation any ferry 123 which is deemed by the Board to be competitive with any bridge to be constructed, the cost of all 124 machinery and equipment, financing charges, interest prior to and during construction and for one year 125 after completion of construction, cost of traffic estimates and of engineering data, engineering and legal 126 expenses, cost of plans, specifications and surveys, estimates of cost and of revenues, other expenses 127 necessary or incident to determining the feasibility or practicability of the enterprise, administrative 128 expense and such other expenses as may be necessary or incident to the financing herein authorized, the 129 construction of the project, the placing of the project in operation and the condemnation of property 130 necessary for such construction and operation.

131 (7) The word "owner" includes all individuals, incorporated companies, copartnerships, societies or 132 associations having any title or interest in any property rights, easements or franchises authorized to be 133 acquired by this article. 134

(8) [Repealed.]

135 (9) The words "revenue" and "revenues" include tolls and any other moneys received or pledged by 136 the Board pursuant to this article, including, without limitation, legally available *Transportation* Trust 137 Fund revenues and any federal highway reimbursements and any other federal highway assistance 138 received from time to time by the Commonwealth.

139 (10) The terms "toll project" and "toll projects" mean projects financed in whole or in part through 140 the issuance of revenue bonds which are secured by toll revenues generated by such project or projects.

141 § 33.1-269. General powers of Board.

142 The Commonwealth Transportation Board may, subject to the provisions of this article:

143 1. Acquire by purchase or by condemnation, construct, improve, operate and maintain any one or 144 more of the projects mentioned and included in the undertaking defined in this article;

145 2. Issue revenue bonds of the Commonwealth, to be known and designated as "Commonwealth of 146 Virginia Toll Revenue Bonds," payable from earnings and from any other available sources of funds, to 147 pay the cost of such projects;

148 3. Subject to the limitations and approvals of § 33.1-279.1, issue revenue bonds of the 149 Commonwealth to be known and designated as "Commonwealth of Virginia Transportation Contract 150 Revenue Bonds," secured by Transportation Trust Fund revenues under a payment agreement between 151 the Board and the Treasury Board, subject to their appropriation by the General Assembly and payable 152 first from revenues received pursuant to contracts with a primary highway transportation improvement 153 district or transportation service district or other local revenue sources for which specific funding of any 154 such bonds may be authorized by law; second, to the extent required, from funds appropriated and 155 allocated, pursuant to the highway allocation formula as provided by law, to the highway construction 156 district in which the project or projects to be financed are located or to the county or counties in which 157 the project or projects to be financed are located; and third, to the extent required, from other legally 158 available revenues of the Trust Fund and from any other available source of funds;

159 4. Issue revenue bonds of the Commonwealth to be known and designated as "Commonwealth of 160 Virginia Transportation Revenue Bonds," secured (i) by revenues received from the U.S. Route 58 Corridor Development Fund, subject to their appropriation by the General Assembly, (ii) to the extent 161 162 required, from revenues legally available from the Transportation Trust Fund and (iii) to the extent required, from any other legally available funds which have been appropriated by the General Assembly; 163 164 4a. Issue revenue bonds of the Commonwealth to be known and designated as "Commonwealth of Virginia Transportation Revenue Bonds," secured, subject to their appropriation by the General Assembly, first from (i) revenues received from the Northern Virginia Transportation District Fund, (ii) 165 166 167 to the extent required, funds appropriated and allocated, pursuant to the highway allocation formula as 168 provided by law, to the highway construction district in which the project or projects to be financed are 169 located or to the city or county in which the project or projects to be financed are located, (iii) to the 170 extent required, legally available revenues of the Transportation Trust Fund, and (iv) such other funds 171 which may be appropriated by the General Assembly;

172 4b. Issue revenue bonds of the Commonwealth to be known and designated as "Commonwealth of Virginia Transportation Program Revenue Bonds" secured, subject to their appropriation by the General 173 174 Assembly, first from (i) any revenues received from any Set-aside Fund established by the General 175 Assembly pursuant to § 58.1-816.1, (ii) to the extent required, revenues received pursuant to any 176 contract with a local jurisdiction or any alternative mechanism for generation of local revenues for 177 specific funding of a project satisfactory to the Commonwealth Transportation Board, (iii) to the extent required, funds appropriated and allocated, pursuant to the highway allocation formula as provided by 178

179 law, to the highway construction district in which the project or projects to be financed are located or to
180 the city or county in which the project or projects to be financed are located, (iv) to the extent required,
181 legally available revenues of the Transportation Trust Fund, and (v) such other funds which may be
182 appropriated by the General Assembly. No bonds for any project or projects shall be issued under the
183 authority of this subsection unless such project or projects are specifically included in a bill or resolution
184 passed by the General Assembly;

185 4c. Issue revenue bonds of the Commonwealth to be known and designated as "Commonwealth of 186 Virginia Transportation Program Revenue Bonds" secured, subject to their appropriation by the General 187 Assembly, first from (i) any revenues received from the Commonwealth Transit Capital Fund established 188 by the General Assembly pursuant to subdivision A 4 g of § 58.1-638, (ii) to the extent required, legally 189 available revenues of the Transportation Trust Fund, and (iii) such other funds which may be 190 appropriated by the General Assembly. No bonds for any project or projects shall be issued under the 191 authority of this subsection unless such project or projects are specifically included in a bill or resolution 192 passed by the General Assembly;

4d. Issue revenue bonds of the Commonwealth from time to time to be known and designated as
"Commonwealth of Virginia Federal Highway Reimbursement Anticipation Notes" secured, subject to
their appropriation by the General Assembly, (i) first from any federal highway reimbursements and any
other federal highway assistance received from time to time by the Commonwealth, (ii) then, at the
discretion of the Board, to the extent required, from legally available revenues of the Transportation
Trust Fund, and (iii) then from such other funds, if any, which are designated by the General Assembly
for such purpose;

5. Fix and collect tolls and other charges for the use of such projects or to refinance the cost of such projects;

6. Construct grade separations at intersections of any projects with public highways, streets or other
public ways or places and change and adjust the lines and grades thereof so as to accommodate the
same to the design of such grade separations, the cost of such grade separations and any damage
incurred in changing and adjusting the lines and grades of such highways, streets, ways and places to be
ascertained and paid by the Board as a part of the cost of the project;

207 7. Vacate or change the location of any portion of any public highway, street or other public way or 208 place and reconstruct the same at such new location as the Board deems most favorable for the project 209 and of substantially the same type and in as good condition as the original highway, streets, way or 210 place, the cost of such reconstruction and any damage incurred in vacating or changing the location 211 thereof to be ascertained and paid by the Board as a part of the cost of the project. Any public highway, 212 street or other public way or place vacated or relocated by the Board shall be vacated or relocated in the 213 manner provided by law for the vacation or relocation of public roads and any damages awarded on 214 account thereof may be paid by the Board as a part of the cost of the project;

215 8. Make reasonable regulations for the installation, construction, maintenance, repair, renewal and relocation of pipes, mains, sewers, conduits, cables, wires, towers, poles and other equipment and appliances herein called "public utility facilities," of the Commonwealth and of any municipality, county, 216 217 218 or other political subdivision, public utility or public service corporation owning or operating the same 219 in, on, along, over or under the project. Whenever the Board determines that it is necessary that any 220 such public utility facilities should be relocated or removed, the Commonwealth or such municipality, 221 county, political subdivision, public utility or public service corporation shall relocate or remove the 222 same in accordance with the order of the Board. The cost and expense of such relocation or removal, 223 including the cost of installing such public utility facilities in a new location or locations, and the cost 224 of any lands or any rights or interests in lands, and any other rights acquired to accomplish such 225 relocation or removal shall be ascertained by the Board.

226 On any toll project, the Board shall pay the cost and expense of relocation or removal as a part of 227 the cost of the project for those public utility facilities owned or operated by the Commonwealth or such municipality, county, political subdivision, public utility or public service corporation. On all other 228 229 projects, under this article, the Board shall pay the cost and expense of relocation or removal as a part 230 of the cost of the project for those public utility facilities owned or operated by the Commonwealth or 231 such municipality, county, or political subdivision. The Commonwealth or such municipality, county, 232 political subdivision, public utility or public service corporation may maintain and operate such public 233 utility facilities with the necessary appurtenances, in the new location or locations, for as long a period 234 and upon the same terms and conditions as it had the right to maintain and operate such public utility 235 facilities in their former location or locations;

236 9. Acquire by the exercise of the power of eminent domain any lands, property, rights, rights-of-way,
237 franchises, easements and other property, including public lands, parks, playgrounds, reservations,
238 highways or parkways, or parts thereof or rights therein, of any municipality, county or other political
239 subdivision, deemed necessary or convenient for the construction or the efficient operation of the project

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240 or necessary in the restoration, replacement or relocation of public or private property damaged or 241 destroyed.

242 The cost of such projects shall be paid solely from the proceeds of Commonwealth of Virginia Toll 243 or Transportation Contract Revenue Bonds or a combination thereof or from such proceeds and from 244 any grant or contribution which may be made thereto pursuant to the provisions of this article; and

245 10. Notwithstanding any provision of this article to the contrary, the Board shall be authorized to 246 exercise the powers conferred herein, in addition to its general powers to acquire rights-of-way and to 247 construct, operate and maintain state highways, with respect to any project which the General Assembly 248 has authorized or may hereafter authorize to be financed in whole or in part through the issuance of 249 bonds of the Commonwealth pursuant to the provisions of Section 9 (c) of Article X of the Constitution 250 of Virginia. 251

§ 33.1-276. Revenue bonds.

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252 The Board may provide by resolution, at one time or from time to time, for the issuance of revenue 253 bonds, notes, or other revenue obligations of the Commonwealth for the purpose of paying all or any 254 part of the cost as hereinabove defined of any one or more projects as hereinabove defined. The 255 principal or purchase price of, and redemption premium, if any, and interest of on such bonds 256 obligations shall be payable solely from the special funds herein provided for such payment. "Special 257 funds" for the purposes of this section shall include any such funds established for Commonwealth of 258 Virginia Toll Revenue Bonds, Commonwealth of Virginia Transportation Contract Revenue Bonds, or 259 Commonwealth of Virginia Transportation Revenue Bonds, or Commonwealth of Virginia Federal 260 Highway Reimbursement Anticipation Notes.

§ 33.1-277. Credit of Commonwealth not pledged.

A. Commonwealth of Virginia Toll Revenue Bonds issued under the provisions of this article shall 262 not be deemed to constitute a debt of the Commonwealth of Virginia or a pledge of the faith and credit 263 264 of the Commonwealth, but such bonds shall be payable solely from the funds herein provided therefor 265 from tolls and revenues, from bond proceeds or earnings thereon and from any other available sources 266 of funds. All such bonds shall state on their face that the Commonwealth of Virginia is not obligated to pay the same or the interest thereon except from the special fund provided therefor from tolls and 267 268 revenues under this article, from bond proceeds or earnings thereon and from any other available sources 269 of funds and that the faith and credit of the Commonwealth are not pledged to the payment of the 270 principal or interest of such bonds. The issuance of such revenue bonds under the provisions of this 271 article shall not directly or indirectly or contingently obligate the Commonwealth to levy or to pledge 272 any form of taxation whatever therefor or to make any appropriation for their payment, other than 273 appropriate available funds derived as revenues from tolls and charges under this article or derived from 274 bond proceeds or earnings thereon and from any other available sources of funds.

275 B. Commonwealth of Virginia Transportation Contract Revenue Bonds issued under the provisions of 276 this article shall not be deemed to constitute a debt of the Commonwealth of Virginia or a pledge of the 277 faith and credit of the Commonwealth, but such bonds shall be payable solely from the funds herein 278 provided therefor (i) from revenues received pursuant to contracts with a primary highway transportation 279 district or transportation service district or any other alternative mechanism for generation of local 280 revenues for specific funding of a project satisfactory to the Commonwealth Transportation Board, (ii) to 281 the extent required, from funds appropriated and allocated, pursuant to the highway allocation formula as 282 provided by law, to the highway construction district in which the project or projects to be financed are 283 located or to the county or counties in which such project or projects are located, (iii) from bond proceeds or earnings thereon, (iv) to the extent required, from other legally available revenues of the 284 Trust Fund, and (v) from any other available source of funds. All such bonds shall state on their face 285 286 that the Commonwealth of Virginia is not obligated to pay the same or the interest thereon except from 287 revenues in clauses (i) and (iii) hereof and that the faith and credit of the Commonwealth are not 288 pledged to the payment of the principal and interest of such bonds. The issuance of such revenue bonds 289 under the provisions of this article shall not directly or indirectly or contingently obligate the 290 Commonwealth to levy or to pledge any form of taxation whatever or to make any appropriation for their payment, other than to appropriate available funds derived as revenues under this article from the 291 292 sources set forth in clauses (i) and (iii) hereof. Nothing in this article shall be construed to obligate the 293 General Assembly to make any appropriation of the funds set forth in clause (ii) or (iv) hereof for 294 payment of such bonds.

295 C. Commonwealth of Virginia Transportation Revenue Bonds issued under the provisions of this 296 article shall not be deemed to constitute a debt of the Commonwealth of Virginia or a pledge of the full 297 faith and credit of the Commonwealth, but such bonds shall be payable solely from the funds herein 298 provided therefor (i) from revenues received from the U.S. Route 58 Corridor Development Fund, 299 subject to their appropriation by the General Assembly, (ii) to the extent required, from revenues legally 300 available from the Transportation Trust Fund and (iii) to the extent required, from any other legally

301 available funds which shall have been appropriated by the General Assembly.

302 D. Commonwealth of Virginia Transportation Revenue Bonds issued under this article for Category 1 303 projects as provided in subdivision (2) (s) of § 33.1-268 shall not be deemed to constitute a debt of the 304 Commonwealth of Virginia or a pledge of the faith and credit of the Commonwealth. Such bonds shall be payable solely, subject to their appropriation by the General Assembly, first from (i) revenues 305 306 received from the Northern Virginia Transportation District Fund, (ii) to the extent required, funds 307 appropriated and allocated, pursuant to the highway allocation formula as provided by law, to the 308 highway construction district in which the project or projects to be financed are located or to the city or 309 county in which the project or projects to be financed are located, (iii) to the extent required, legally 310 available revenues of the Transportation Trust Fund, and (iv) such other funds which may be 311 appropriated by the General Assembly.

312 E. Commonwealth of Virginia Transportation Program Revenue Bonds issued under this article for 313 projects defined in subdivision (2) (t) of § 33.1-268 shall not be deemed to constitute a debt of the 314 Commonwealth or a pledge of the faith and credit of the Commonwealth. Such bonds shall be payable 315 solely, subject to their appropriation by the General Assembly, first from (i) any revenues received from 316 any Set-aside Fund established by the General Assembly pursuant to § 58.1-816.1, (ii) to the extent required, revenues received pursuant to any contract with a local jurisdiction or any alternative 317 318 mechanism for generation of local revenues for specific funding of a project satisfactory to the 319 Commonwealth Transportation Board, (iii) to the extent required, funds appropriated and allocated, 320 pursuant to the highway allocation formula as provided by law, to the highway construction district in 321 which the project or projects to be financed are located or to the city or county in which the project or 322 projects to be financed are located, (iv) to the extent required, legally available revenues from the 323 Transportation Trust Fund, and (v) such other funds which may be appropriated by the General 324 Assembly.

325 F. Commonwealth of Virginia Federal Highway Reimbursement Anticipation Notes issued under this article shall not be deemed to constitute a debt of the Commonwealth of Virginia or a pledge of the full 326 faith and credit of the Commonwealth, but such obligations shall be payable solely, subject to 327 328 appropriation by the General Assembly, (i) first from any federal highway reimbursements and any other 329 federal highway assistance received from time to time by the Commonwealth, (ii) then, at the discretion 330 of the Board, to the extent required, from legally available revenues of the Transportation Trust Fund, 331 and (iii) then, from such other funds, if any, which are designated by the General Assembly for such 332 purpose. 333

§ 33.1-278. Form and terms of bonds.

334 The bonds of such issue shall be dated, shall bear interest at such rate or rates and shall mature at 335 such time or times, not exceeding forty years from their date or dates, as may be determined by the 336 Board or by formula or method established by resolution of the Board, and may be made redeemable before maturity, at the option of the Board, at such price or prices and under such terms and conditions 337 as may be fixed by the Board prior to the issuance of the bonds. The principal or purchase price of, and 338 redemption premium, if any, and interest of on, such bonds may be made payable in any lawful 339 340 medium. The payments of principal and interest may be uniform in amount over the life of the bond; 341 however, such uniformity shall not be a prerequisite to the issuance of such bonds. The Board shall 342 determine the form of the bonds, including any interest coupons to be attached thereto, and shall fix the 343 denomination or denominations of the bonds and the place or places of payment of principal and interest 344 thereof, which may be at any bank or trust company within or without the Commonwealth. The bonds 345 shall be signed by the Commonwealth Transportation Commissioner chairman or vice-chairman of the 346 *Board* and the official seal of the Board shall be affixed thereto and attested by the secretary or 347 assistant secretary of the Board and any coupons attached thereto shall bear the facsimile signatures of 348 the Commonwealth Transportation Commissioner chairman or vice-chairman of the Board. When any 349 officer whose signature appears on the bonds or coupons ceases to be such officer before the delivery of 350 such bonds, such signature shall nevertheless be valid and sufficient for all purposes the same as if he 351 such officer had remained in office until such delivery. All revenue bonds issued under the provisions of 352 this article shall have and are hereby declared to have, as between successive holders, all the qualities 353 and incidents of negotiable instruments under the negotiable instruments law of the Commonwealth. 354 Such bonds and the income thereof shall be exempt from all taxation within the Commonwealth. The 355 bonds may be issued in coupon or in registered form, or both, as the Board may determine, and 356 provision may be made for the registration of any coupon bond as to principal alone and also as to both 357 principal and interest and for the reconversion of any bonds registered as to both principal and interest 358 into coupon bonds. Prior to the preparation of definite bonds, the Board, under like restrictions, may 359 issue temporary bonds with or without coupons, exchangeable for definitive bonds upon the issuance of the latter. The Board may also provide for the replacement of any bond which is mutilated, destroyed or 360 361 lost.

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362 § 33.1-280. Sale of bonds; bonds as legal investments.

The Board may sell such bonds in such manner and for such price as it may determine to be for the best interests of the Commonwealth, but no such sale shall be made at a price so low as to require the payment of interest on the money received therefor at more than six the maximum per centum per annum approved by the Commonwealth Treasury Board with respect to such obligations in accordance with § 2.1-179 of the Code of Virginia, as amended, computed with relation to the absolute maturity of the bonds in accordance with standard tables of bond values, excluding, however, from such computations the amount of any premium to be paid on redemption for any bonds prior to maturity.

All bonds heretofore or hereafter issued pursuant to the authority of this article are hereby made
securities in which all public officers and bodies of this Commonwealth and all political subdivisions
thereof, all insurance companies and associations, all national banks and trust companies, and savings
institutions, including savings and loan associations, in the Commonwealth, and all executors,
administrators, trustees, and other fiduciaries, both individual or corporate, may properly and legally
invest funds within their control.

376 § 33.1-284. Trust indenture.

377 In the discretion of the Board, each or any issue of revenue bonds may be secured by a trust 378 indenture by and between the Board and a corporate trustee, which may be any trust company or bank 379 having the trust powers of a trust company within or outside of the Commonwealth. Such trust 380 indenture may pledge tolls and revenues to be received, but no such trust indenture shall convey or 381 mortgage any project or any part thereof. Either the resolution providing for the issuance of revenue 382 bonds or such trust indenture may contain such provisions for protecting and enforcing the rights and 383 remedies of the bondholders as may be reasonable and proper and not in violation of law, including 384 covenants setting forth the duties of the Board in relation to the acquisition, construction, improvement, 385 maintenance, operation, repair and insurance of the projects and the custody, safeguarding and 386 application of all moneys. Such resolution or trust indenture may also provide that the project or 387 projects shall be acquired, or acquired and improved, or constructed, and paid for under the supervision 388 and approval of consulting engineers employed or designated by the Board and satisfactory to the 389 original purchasers of the bonds issued therefor and may also require that the security given by 390 contractors and by any depository of the proceeds of the bonds or revenues of the project or projects or 391 other moneys pertaining thereto be satisfactory to such purchasers. Any bank or trust company 392 incorporated under the laws of this within or outside of the Commonwealth may act as such depository 393 and furnish such indemnifying bonds or pledge such securities as may be required by the Board. Such 394 indenture may set forth the rights and remedies of the bondholders and of the trustee and may restrict 395 the individual right of action of bondholders as is customary in trust indentures securing bonds and 396 debentures of corporations. In addition to the foregoing, such trust indenture may contain such other 397 provisions as the Board may deem reasonable and proper for the security of the bondholders. Except as 398 in this article otherwise provided, the Board may provide, by resolution or by such trust indenture, that after the payment of the proceeds of the sale of the bonds and the revenues of the project or projects 399 400 into the state treasury the Board will immediately transfer or pay same over to such officer, board or depository as it may determine for the custody thereof and for the method of disbursement thereof, with 401 402 such safeguards and restrictions as it may determine. All expenses incurred in carrying out such trust 403 indenture may be treated as a part of the cost of maintenance, operation and repairs of the project or projects affected by such indenture. **404**

405 2. That the Commonwealth Transportation Board is authorized, by and with the consent of the 406 Governor, to issue Commonwealth of Virginia Federal Highway Reimbursement Anticipation 407 Notes, as follows:

408 Whereas, Section 9 (d) of Article X of the Constitution of Virginia and §§ 33.1-267 through
409 33.1-295 of the Code of Virginia, as amended, provide that the General Assembly may authorize the
410 issuance of bonds or notes secured and payable subject to appropriations therefor by the General
411 Assembly; and

Whereas, in accordance with the National Highway System Designation Act of 1995, and the federal
Transportation Equity Act for the 21st Century, states may issue Grant Anticipation Revenue Vehicles
which are securities issued in anticipation of, and payable from, federal reimbursements with respect to
federal aid transportation projects; and

Whereas, utilizing Grant Anticipation Revenue Vehicles, to be designated as Commonwealth of
Virginia Federal Highway Reimbursement Anticipation Notes, on an ongoing basis to finance projects
included in the Commonwealth Transportation Board's Six-Year Improvement Program will accelerate
transportation projects that improve safety, reduce congestion, and stimulate economic development;
now, therefore,

421 § 1. This Act shall be known and may be cited as the "Commonwealth of Virginia Federal Highway
 422 Reimbursement Anticipation Notes Act of 2000."

423 § 2. The Commonwealth Transportation Board is hereby authorized, by and with the consent of the 424 Governor, to issue, pursuant to the provisions of §§ 33.1-267 through 33.1-295 of the Code of Virginia, 425 as amended, from time to time revenue obligations of the Commonwealth to be designated 426 "Commonwealth of Virginia Federal Highway Reimbursement Anticipation Notes, Series," provided 427 that the aggregate principal amount outstanding at any time shall not exceed \$800,000,000 (exclusive of 428 any obligations that may be issued to refund such notes in accordance with § 33.1-293 of the Code of 429 Virginia, as amended) plus an amount for financing expenses, (including, without limitation, any 430 original issue discount) (the Notes). The net proceeds of the Notes shall be used exclusively for the 431 purpose of providing funds, together with any other available funds, for paying the costs, incurred or to 432 be incurred for construction or funding of such projects to be designated from time to time by the 433 General Assembly; provided, however, at the discretion of the Commonwealth Transportation Board, 434 funds allocated to projects within a transportation district may be allocated among projects within the 435 same transportation district as needed to meet construction cash-flow needs.

436 § 3. The proceeds of Notes, including any premium received on the sale thereof, shall be made
437 available by the Commonwealth Transportation Board to pay costs of the projects and, where
438 appropriate, may be paid to any authority, locality, commission or other entity for the purposes of
439 paying for costs of the projects. The proceeds of Notes may be used together with any federal, local or
440 private funds which may be made available for such purpose. The proceeds of Notes, together with any
441 investment earnings thereon, may at the discretion of the Commonwealth Transportation Board secure
442 the payment of principal or purchase price of and redemption premium, if any, and interest on Notes.

443 § 4. The terms and structure of each issue of Notes shall be determined by the Commonwealth 444 Transportation Board, subject to approval by the Treasury Board in accordance with § 2.1-179 of the 445 Code of Virginia, as amended. The Notes of each issue shall be dated, shall be issued in a principal 446 amount (subject to the limitation as to amount outstanding at any one time set forth in § 2), shall bear 447 interest at such rate or rates which may be fixed, adjustable, variable or a combination thereof, and 448 may be determined by a formula or other method, shall mature at such time or times not exceeding ten 449 years after the issuance thereof, and may be made subject to purchase or redemption before their 450 maturity or maturities, at such price or prices and under such terms and conditions, all as may be 451 determined by the Commonwealth Transportation Board. The Commonwealth Transportation Board shall 452 determine the form of Notes, whether Notes are certificated or uncertificated, and fix the authorized 453 denomination or denominations of Notes and the place or places of payment of principal or purchase 454 price of, and redemption premium, if any, and interest on, Notes, which may be at the office of the State 455 Treasurer or any bank or trust company within or without the Commonwealth. The principal or 456 purchase price of, and redemption premium, if any, and interest on, Notes shall be made payable in 457 lawful money of the United States of America. Each issue of Notes may be issued under a system of 458 book entry for recording the ownership and transfer of ownership of rights to receive payments of 459 principal or purchase price of and redemption premium, if any, and interest on such Notes. All Notes 460 shall have and are hereby declared to have, as between successive holders, all the qualities and 461 incidents of negotiable instruments under the negotiable instruments law of the Commonwealth.

462 The Commonwealth Transportation Board may sell Notes from time to time at public or private sale,
463 by competitive bidding, negotiated sale or private placement, for such price or prices as it may
464 determine to be in the best interests of the Commonwealth.

465 § 5. The Notes shall be signed on behalf of the Commonwealth Transportation Board by the 466 chairman or vice-chairman of the Commonwealth Transportation Board, or shall bear the facsimile 467 signature of such officer, and shall bear the official seal of the Board, which shall be attested by the 468 manual or facsimile signature of the secretary or assistant secretary of the Commonwealth 469 Transportation Board. In the event that Notes shall bear the facsimile signature of the chairman or vice 470 chairman of the Commonwealth Transportation Board, such Notes shall be signed by such 471 administrative assistant as the chairman of the Transportation Board shall determine or by any 472 registrar/paying agent that may be designated by the Commonwealth Transportation Board. In case any 473 officer whose signature or a facsimile of whose signature appears on any Notes shall cease to be such 474 officer before the delivery of such Notes, such signature or facsimile signature nevertheless shall be 475 valid and sufficient for all purposes as if such officer had remained in office until such delivery.

476 § 6. All expenses incurred under this Act or in connection with issuance of Notes shall be paid from
477 the proceeds of such Notes or from any available funds as the Commonwealth Transportation Board
478 shall determine.

479 § 7. The Commonwealth Transportation Board is hereby authorized to borrow money at such rate or rates through the execution and issuance of notes for the same, but only in the following circumstances and under the following conditions:

482 a. In anticipation of the sale of Notes the issuance of which shall have been authorized by the
 483 Commonwealth Transportation Board and shall have been approved by the Governor, if the

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484 Commonwealth Transportation Board shall deem it advisable to postpone the issuance of such Notes; or 485 b. For the renewal of any anticipation notes herein authorized.

486 § 8. The proceeds of Notes and of any anticipation notes herein authorized (except the proceeds of 487 the Notes the issuance of which has been anticipated by such anticipation notes) shall be placed by the 488 State Treasurer in a special fund in the state treasury, or may be placed with a trustee in accordance 489 with § 33.1-283 of the Code of Virginia, as amended, and shall be disbursed only for the purpose for 490 which such Notes and such anticipation notes shall be issued; provided, however, proceeds derived from 491 the sale of Notes herein authorized shall be first used in the payment of any anticipation notes that may have been issued in anticipation of the sale of such Notes and any renewals of such notes. The proceeds 492 493 of Notes and of any anticipation notes herein authorized, together with any investment earnings thereon, 494 shall not be taken into account in computing, and shall be in addition to funds allocated pursuant to, 495 the highway allocation formula set forth in § 33.1-23.1 of the Code of Virginia, as amended.

496 § 9. The Commonwealth Transportation Board is hereby authorized to receive any other funds that 497 may be made available to pay costs of the projects and, subject to appropriation, to make available the 498 same to the payment of the principal or purchase price of, and redemption premium, if any, and interest 499 on, Notes authorized hereby and to enter into the appropriate agreements to allow for those funds to be 500 paid into the state treasury, or to a trustee in accordance with § 33.1-283 of the Code of Virginia, as 501 amended, to pay a part of the costs of the projects or to pay principal or purchase price of, and 502 redemption premium, if any, and interest on Notes.

503 § 10. In accordance with Section 7 of Article X of the Constitution of Virginia and § 2.1-180 of the 504 Code of Virginia, as amended, all federal highway reimbursements and other federal highway assistance 505 received by the Commonwealth from time to time shall be paid into the state treasury. The 506 Commonwealth Transportation Board, in connection with the issuance of Notes, shall establish a fund in 507 accordance with § 33.1-286 of the Code of Virginia, as amended, either in the state treasury or with a 508 trustee in accordance with § 33.1-283 of the Code of Virginia, as amended, which shall secure and be used for the payment of Notes to the credit of which there shall be deposited such amounts, 509 510 appropriated therefor by the General Assembly, as are required to pay principal or purchase price of, 511 and redemption premium, if any, and interest on, Notes, as and when due and payable, (i) first from any 512 federal highway reimbursements and any other federal highway assistance received from time to time by 513 the Commonwealth, (ii) then, at the discretion of the Commonwealth Transportation Board, to the extent 514 required, from legally available revenues of the Transportation Trust Fund, and (iii) then from such 515 other funds, if any, which may be designated by the General Assembly for such purpose.

516 § 11. Note proceeds and moneys in any reserve funds and sinking funds in respect of Notes shall be 517 invested by the State Treasurer in accordance with the provisions of general law relating to the 518 investment of such funds belonging to or in the control of the Commonwealth, or by a trustee in accordance with § 33.1-283 of the Code of Virginia, as amended. 519

520 § 12. The interest income from, and any profit made on the sale of, the obligations issued under the 521 provisions of this Act shall at all times be free and exempt from taxation by the Commonwealth and by 522 any municipality, county or other political subdivision thereof.

523 § 13. All obligations issued under the provisions of this Act are hereby made securities in which all 524 persons and entities listed in § 33.1-280 of the Code of Virginia, as amended, may properly and legally 525 invest funds under their control.

526 3. That the General Assembly designates the following projects and may designate others from 527 time to time for funding from the proceeds from the Notes issued pursuant to the second 528 enactment of this act, from the Priority Transportation Fund, and from any other available funds: 529 BRISTOL DISTRICT PROJECTS Funding 520

That in addition to the amounts paid from the general fund pursuant to § 58.1-815 of the Code 928 of Virginia, from July 1, 2000, through June 30, 2002, there is hereby appropriated \$379,931,000 929 from the general fund for transportation purposes as follows: 930 § 1. From July 1, 2000, through June 30, 2002, \$20,585,038 in the first fiscal year and \$14,700,000 in the second fiscal year shall be appropriated to the mass transit assistance program for a statewide 931 new transit vehicle and equipment program to be administered by the Department of Rail and Public 932 Transportation. In addition to the amounts from the general fund, \$6,646,962 in the first fiscal year and 933 934 \$10,354,962 in the second fiscal year from federal highway funds shall be appropriated to this program.

935 Such federal funds, as apportioned under Title 23 of the United States Code, shall be derived from six 936 percent of surface transportation program funds allocated pursuant to § 33.1-23.1 of the Code of

Virginia and ten percent from minimum guarantee program funds in each fiscal year with an additional

938 \$4,000,000 in minimum guarantee funds allocated to the Virginia Railway Express in the first fiscal 939 year by action of the Commonwealth Transportation Board. The statewide new transit vehicle and 940 equipment program shall be a competitive grant program with no less than \$1,300,000 for the Hampton 941 Roads Innovative Regional Bus Plan in the first fiscal year and no less than \$1,300,000 for the Greater Richmond Transit Company (GRTC) new or extended bus service in each fiscal year. The Program shall 942 943 include both suburban and rural small transit systems and be on a statewide basis. The Commonwealth 944 Transportation Board, at its discretion, may apply subdivision 4 f of § 58.1-638 to allocate all funds in 945 this section. 946 § 2. From July 1, 2000, through June 30, 2001, \$25,000,000 shall be appropriated to the Virginia 947 Airports Revolving Loan Fund pursuant to Chapter 2.1 (§ 5.1-30.1 et seq.) of Title 5.1 of the Code of 948 Virginia. 949 § 3. From July 1, 2001, through June 30, 2002, \$5,000,000 to the airport assistance program 950 administered by the Department of Aviation for a statewide competitive capital grant program for 951 privately owned designated reliever airports, privately owned local service airports, and privately owned community service airports. The Department of Aviation shall develop guidelines for such program and implement the program effective July 1, 2001. The Department of Aviation shall report on such 952 953 954 guidelines, criteria, and performance measures for the program to the 2002 Session of the General 955 Assembly. 956 § 4. From July 1, 2000, through June 30, 2001, \$2,000,000 shall be designated to the Smithsonian 957 Institution for the "Virginia Appropriation" pursuant to the requirements of the Memorandum of 958 Understanding between the Commonwealth and the Smithsonian Institution concerning the National Air 959 and Space Museum Extension. 960 § 5. From July 1, 2000, through June 30, 2002, \$3,052,000 shall be appropriated to the water 961 transportation system planning program administered by the Virginia Port Authority. From these 962 appropriations, \$1,500,000 the first fiscal year and \$852,000 the second fiscal year shall be used for matching funds required by the Water Resources Development Act of 1986 (Public Law 99-262), as 963 964 amended, for a study of the eastward expansion of the federally owned Craney Island Dredged Material 965 Management Area. In addition, from these appropriations, \$500,000 in the first fiscal year and \$200,000 966 in the second fiscal year shall be used to begin the dredging of the inbound channel of the Norfolk 967 Harbor Channel. § 6. A. From July 1, 2000, through June 30, 2002, \$239,284,000 the first fiscal year and 968 969 \$68,047,000 the second fiscal year shall be appropriated for specified highway projects around the 970 Commonwealth. Notwithstanding the provisions of Article 1.1 (§ 33.1-23.01 et seq.) of Title 33.1 of the 971 Code of Virginia, such general funds shall be used to ensure that highway construction projects have 972 sufficient state funds available for payment of the state share of expenditures in the year the expenditure 973 shall occur. No expenditure, allocation, or other use of such amounts in the specific construction district 974 shall be considered in allocating highway maintenance and construction funds under § 33.1-23.1, but 975 shall be in addition thereto. Further, such allocations from the general fund to interstate projects shall 976 not be defined as "interstate federal-aid match" for federal fund allocation or matching purposes. 977 B. The Commonwealth Transportation Board may reduce the general fund amount to any individual 978 project specified in this section of enactment 4 if the Commonwealth Transportation Commissioner 979 determines, in writing, that an individual project cannot use such general funds because of **980** environmental, legal, cost adjustments, or other project management considerations. When such general 981 funds become available, such funds shall be allocated by the Commonwealth Transportation Board to 982 another transportation project in the same construction district. The Commonwealth Transportation 983 Board shall report such actions to the chairmen of the House Appropriations and Senate Finance 984 Committees within 30 days of taking such action.

C. The general fund appropriation in the first fiscal year under this section shall be allocated to each project to provide the funding identified as "Year 1" multiplied by 1,000. The general fund appropriation under this section in the second fiscal year shall be allocated to each project to provide the funding identified as "Year 2" and "Year 3" multiplied by 1,000. The Commonwealth Transportation Board's Six-Year Improvement Program as it existed on January 1, 2000, for the six fiscal years beginning on July 1, 2000, and ending on June 30, 2006, is revised and amended as follows, and the projects to which general funds shall be allocated pursuant to this section of enactment 4, and the year of the allocation, are as follows:

5. That, in addition to the general fund appropriations in enactment 4, from July 1, 2000, through June 30, 2002, the Commonwealth Transportation Board shall allocate pursuant to § 33.1-23.03:8 of this act and the Comptroller shall deposit, \$85,800,000 from State highway construction funds in the first fiscal year and \$54,600,000 in the second fiscal year to the Priority Transportation Fund. In addition, the Commonwealth Transportation Board shall allocate from federal highway apportionments \$41,800,000 in the first fiscal year and \$56,000,000 in the second fiscal year to the Priority Transportation Fund.

1761 6. That the allocations in the Six-Year Improvement Program required each year pursuant to
1762 enactment 2 of this act shall be proportional to the amount of Federal Highway Reimbursement
1763 Anticipation Note proceeds allocated to each construction district.

1764 7. That, as a condition of the financial assistance for projects located in a city or county provided 1765 by this act, such city or county may not reduce its local contribution to Metrorail capital 1766 improvements below the FY 00 local contribution to Metrorail capital improvements.

1767 8. That, insofar as the provisions of this act are inconsistent with the provisions of any other 1768 general, special or local law, the provisions of this act shall be controlling.

1769 9. That if any clause, sentence, paragraph, section, or part of this act or the application thereof to
1770 any person or circumstance is adjudged invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such
1771 judgment shall not affect the validity of the remainder hereof but shall be confined to the clause,
1772 sentence, paragraph, section, or part hereof directly involved in the controversy in which such
1773 judgment shall have been rendered, and to this end the provisions of this act are severable.

10. That beginning July 1, 2002, there shall be deposited in each fiscal year to the Priority 1774 1775 Transportation Fund from the general fund an amount equal to one-third of the estimated revenue to be collected for all insurance license tax imposed pursuant to Article 2 (§ 58.1-2500 et seq.) of 1776 Chapter 25 of Title 58.1 for each such fiscal year. The Governor shall include the amounts 1777 required to be deposited to the Priority Transportation Fund as provided in this enactment, and 1778 1779 as provided in any other law, in the budget bill submitted to the General Assembly pursuant to 1780 § 2.1-399. For the purposes of any appropriation act enacted by the General Assembly and for the 1781 purposes of the Comptroller's preliminary and final annual reports required by § 2.1-207, all 1782 deposits to the Priority Transportation Fund pursuant to this enactment shall be accounted for and considered to be a part of the general fund of the state treasury.
