2 An Act to amend the Code of Virginia by adding in Title 22.1 a chapter numbered 20.1, consisting of 3 sections numbered 22.1-354.1 through 22.1-354.5, relating to the Western Virginia Public Education 4 Consortium.

7 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

8 1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Title 22.1 a chapter numbered 20.1, 9 consisting of sections numbered 22.1-354.1 through 22.1-354.5, as follows: 10

CHAPTER 20.1.

WESTERN VIRGINIA PUBLIC EDUCATION CONSORTIUM.

12 § 22.1-354.1. Western Virginia Public Education Consortium created; region defined; governing 13 board.

A. The Western Virginia Public Education Consortium is hereby established and shall be referred to 14 15 in this chapter as the Consortium. For the purposes of this chapter and the work of the Consortium, "Western Virginia" shall include the Counties of Alleghany, Bland, Botetourt, Craig, Floyd, Franklin, 16

17 Giles, Montgomery, Pulaski, Roanoke, and Wythe, and the Cities of Covington, Clifton Forge, Radford, Roanoke, and Salem. The governing board of the Consortium shall consist of the school superintendents 18 19 of the named localities. The region's legislators shall serve as nonvoting, advisory members of the 20 board.

21 B. Members of the board shall be reimbursed for their actual expenses incurred in the performance 22 of their duties in the work of the Consortium. The board shall elect a chairman and a vice-chairman 23 from among its members. 24

§ 22.1-354.2. Functions and duties.

The Consortium shall perform the following functions and duties:

26 1. Coordinate with organizations and agencies providing programs and services to Consortium 27 school divisions to reduce duplication of effort and optimize the use of available resources;

28 2. Conduct ongoing assessments to identify needs of member school divisions and develop plans and 29 programs responding to those needs;

30 3. Facilitate the coordination of programs in the Consortium region that affect K through 12 public 31 education in vocational and technical education, workforce development, and other linkages between 32 public schools, institutions of higher education, and business and industry;

33 4. Coordinate technology-related activities between Consortium members in areas of common 34 concern, such as video conferencing and distance learning, including the acquisition and utilization of 35 hardware and software for administrative and instructional purchases;

36 5. Develop and maintain linkages with schools and school divisions in Northern Virginia to promote 37 enhanced usage of educational technology; and

38 6. Create the capacity for development within the Consortium of shared services and activities, 39 including purchasing, facility planning, staff development, and special needs programming, and 40 implementation of such shared services and activities as need is determined.

41 § 22.1-354.3. Executive director; staff support; location.

42 From such funds as may be appropriated or received, the board of the Consortium may appoint an 43 executive director, who shall be authorized to employ such staff as necessary to enable the Consortium to perform its duties as set forth in this chapter. The board is authorized to determine the duties of such 44 45 staff and to fix salaries and compensation from such funds as may be appropriated or received. The Consortium's offices shall be housed at Radford University. 46

§ 22.1-354.4. Application for and acceptance of gifts and grants. 47

48 The Consortium is authorized to apply for, accept, and expend gifts, grants, or donations from public 49 or private sources to enable it to carry out its objectives.

50 § 22.1-354.5. Cooperation of other agencies.

All agencies of the Commonwealth shall cooperate with the Consortium and, upon request, assist the 51 52 Consortium in the performance of its duties and responsibilities.

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
