WHEREAS, Ricky Lee Timbrook, a sergeant with the City of Winchester Police Department, was killed in the line of duty on October 29, 1999; and

WHEREAS, Ricky Lee Timbrook served in the Winchester Police Department as Police Officer I from April 1991 to June 1992, and Police Officer II from July 1992 to May 1994, as Police Officer III from June 1994 to June 1998, and as Sergeant in charge of the newly created special enforcement team from July 1998 to October 1999; and

WHEREAS, Sergeant Timbrook performed commendable service for the City of Winchester by faithfully serving as a DARE officer for the city school system, as a field training officer, and as a member of the Defensive Tactics SWAT team; and

WHEREAS, Sergeant Timbrook received numerous commendations, awards, and recognitions for his law-enforcement service; and

WHEREAS, Ricky Lee Timbrook will be greatly missed by his fellow employees and police officers, and by the elected officials and citizens of Winchester; and

WHEREAS, in recognition of the honorable service of Ricky Lee Timbrook, Winchester's new public safety building was renamed the Timbrook Public Safety Center; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the General Assembly mourn the untimely loss of a dedicated law-enforcement officer, Sergeant Ricky Lee Timbrook; and, be it

RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the Senate prepare a copy of this resolution for presentation to the family of Ricky Lee Timbrook as an expression of the General Assembly's great respect for his memory.
