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| 11 | WHEREAS, the elderly and disabled poor with Medicare health insurance pay a very large |
| 12 | proportion of their monthly income on out-of-pocket medical expenses; and |
| 13 | WHEREAS, nearly half of Virginia's Medicare beneficiaries are low-income; and |
| 14 15 | WHEREAS, low-income Medicare beneficiaries are less likely to have private supplemental insurance than are higher-income Medicare beneficiaries; and |
| 15 16 | WHEREAS, the Qualified Medicare Beneficiary (QMB), Specified Low Income Medicare |
| 17 | Beneficiary (SLIB), and Qualifying Individual (QI-1, QI-2) programs are administered through the |
| 18 | Department of Medical Assistance Services to help pay the Medicare premiums and cost-sharing |
| 19 | requirements for low-income elderly and disabled; and |
| 20 21 | WHEREAS, a significant proportion of Virginians eligible for these programs are not enrolled, due in part to a lack of public awareness and a lack of organized outreach programs; and |
| ²¹ 22 | WHEREAS, studies have shown that community-based efforts have the greatest success in |
| 23 | encouraging low-income elderly and disabled individuals to enroll in these programs; and |
| 24 | WHEREAS, the elderly and disabled have regular contact with the aging community, faith |
| 25 | community, advocacy groups and various health care professionals that could provide information and |
