001174504 **SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 239** 1 234567 AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE (Proposed by the Senate Committee on Rules on February 14, 2000) (Patron Prior to Substitute—Senator Newman) Directing the Joint Commission on Technology and Science to study the impact of the Uniform Computer Information Transactions Act on Virginia businesses, libraries and consumers. 8 WHEREAS, the National Conference of Commissioners on Uniform State Laws has promulgated the 9 Uniform Computer Information Transactions Act (UCITA), and it is now available for consideration for 10 adoption by the several states; and WHEREAS, the UCITA is major legislation that would govern transactions of computer information, 11 12 thereby significantly impacting all Virginians who use computers; and WHEREAS, the UCITA presents a significant policy decision to be made by the General Assembly; 13 14 and 15 WHEREAS, the voluminous pages of the UCITA contain highly technical language and a legal 16 scheme which even legal professionals may have trouble understanding; and WHEREAS, the Commonwealth may be one of the first states to consider this major legislation and 17 18 other states may be looking to the Commonwealth for guidance in considering the UCITA; and WHEREAS, the Commonwealth is the leader in technology and relevant laws and it must be 19 20 responsible in leading other states; now, therefore, be it RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the Joint Commission on Technology and Science be directed to study the impact of the Uniform Computer Information 21 22 23 Transactions Act on Virginia businesses, libraries and consumers; and, be it 24 RESOLVED FURTHER, That a subcommittee of the Commission, consisting of two Commission 25 members of the Senate and two Commission members of the House of Delegates, be directed to work with a citizen advisory group in conducting and providing direction to the study. The advisory group 26 27 shall be comprised of five members as follows: a representative of the Northern Virginia Technology 28 Council; a representative of the Virginia Manufacturing Association; a representative of the insurance 29 industry; a representative of the public libraries; and a representative of the Richmond Technology 30 Council. Members of the advisory group shall serve without compensation or reimbursement for their 31 expenses. 32 All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Commission, upon request. The Joint Commission on Technology and Science shall complete its work in time to submit its

written findings and recommendations by December 1, 2000, to the Governor and the 2001 Session of
the General Assembly as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems
for the processing of legislative documents.

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
