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006249472 **SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 244** 1 2 Offered January 24, 2000 3 Encouraging local governing bodies to establish voluntary citizen review panels. 4 5 6 7 Patrons-Maxwell, Lambert and Miller, Y.B.; Delegates: Christian, Crittenden, Melvin and Robinson Referred to Committee on Rules 8 9 WHEREAS, the Joint Subcommittee Studying the Status and Needs of African-American Males in 10 Virginia was directed to identify factors contributing to the plight of African-American men in the 11 Commonwealth, and to recommend feasible alternatives to address such problems; and WHEREAS, in conducting the study, the joint subcommittee traveled to locations across the 12 13 Commonwealth to solicit public participation and comment regarding educational, cultural, health, 14 economic, political, social, and criminal justice issues of citizens; and 15 WHEREAS, among the plethora of issues considered by the joint subcommittee, a primary concern 16 among citizens, particularly minority and low-income communities, was the tension between citizens and 17 law enforcement agencies; and 18 WHEREAS, many persons, stigmatized by race, ethnicity, and economic status, expressed 19 vehemently their objections to certain police practices, such as racial profiling, slow response to citizen 20 calls, poor communication with citizens, arrogant and condescending attitudes of too many law 21 enforcement officers, abuse of power, alienation and detachment from the community, and the "code of 22 silence"; and 23 WHEREAS, these problems were echoed across the state by persons from diverse backgrounds, and 24 these citizens urged the General Assembly to consider and respond constructively to the simmering 25 hostility and resentment toward law enforcement agencies in many of Virginia's urban areas in which 26 racial and ethnic populations predominate; and WHEREAS, in many jurisdictions throughout the nation, voluntary citizen review panels have been 27 28 established to review and mediate problems between citizens and law enforcement agencies, promote 29 dialogue between elected officials, law enforcement and the constituency; and 30 WHEREAS, voluntary citizen review panels interface with community and civic groups, represent the 31 community before governing bodies concerning proposals and issues affecting quality of life, assist law 32 enforcement agencies in obtaining vital information in the resolution of criminal investigations, facilitate 33 communication between citizens and police, and aid in crime deterrence; and 34 WHEREAS, the creation of such panels in localities throughout Virginia would help to relieve the 35 consternation of citizens and growing attitudes of resentment toward police by affording public 36 participation in resolving community problems; now, therefore, be it RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That local governing bodies be 37 38 encouraged to establish voluntary citizen review panels to present the views of citizens before the governing body, further communication between citizens and law enforcement agencies, and represent 39 40 citizens in seeking resolution to problems with law enforcement agencies; and, be it RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the Senate shall send a copy of this resolution to the 41 42 Executive Director of the Virginia Municipal League, the Director of the Virginia Association of Counties, the Presidents of the Virginia Association of Chiefs of Police and the Virginia Sheriffs 43 Association, requesting that they further disseminate copies of this resolution to their respective 44 constituents so that they may be apprised of the sense of the Virginia General Assembly in this matter. 45
