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10	WHEREAS, the National Institute of Corrections of the United States Department of Justice has
11	recommended to the states the adoption of the Interstate Compact for Adult Offender Supervision; and
12	WHEREAS, this Compact, which would replace an existing compact, is intended to improve
13	communications between local agencies, standardize data collection, measures, and reporting, and expand
14	education, training, and information exchange on parolees and probationers between and among the
15	states and territories of the United States; and
16	WHEREAS, in 1997, approximately three percent of all state probationers and parolees had been
17	transferred out of the state originally paroling them or placing them on probation; and
18	WHEREAS, with the passage of such laws as sex offender registration, it is increasingly important to
19 20	track the location of offenders, transfer supervision authority to the appropriate entity in each jurisdiction
20 21	and when necessary return offenders to originating jurisdictions; and WHEREAS, this Compact is intended to facilitate these governmental functions; now, therefore, be it
$\frac{21}{22}$	RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the Virginia State Crime
$\frac{22}{23}$	Commission be directed to study the Interstate Compact for Adult Offender Supervision. Technical
24	assistance shall be provided to the Commission by the Office of the Attorney General to assure the
25	proper form of the Compact.
26	All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Commission for this study, upon
27	request.
28	The Virginia State Crime Commission shall complete its work in time to submit its findings and
29	recommendations to the Governor and the 2001 Session of the General Assembly as provided in the
30	procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative
31	documents.
