11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
12	1. That §§ 1, 2, and 3, and § 4 as amended of Chapter 630 of the Acts of Assembly of 1964 are
13	amended and reenacted as follows:
14	§ 1. Declaration.
15	The development of a transportation system, composed of transit facilities, public highways, and
16 17	other modes of transport, is necessary for the orderly growth and development of the area hereinafter defined and of the Commonwealth of Virginia; and the . The creation of a transportation district
18	comprising said area as hereinafter provided, in which shall function as a public instrumentality a
19	transportation commission with all of the powers granted by the "Transportation District Act of 1964,"
20	Chapter 45 (§ 15.2-4500 et seq.) of Title 15.2 of the Code of Virginia and amendments thereof, and
21	subject to all the provisions thereof, is hereby determined to be the most advisable means of planning
22	and developing a transportation system required for said area and for the safety, comfort and
23	convenience of its citizens and for the economical utilization of public funds.
24 25	The General Assembly finds that duplications of effort and diffusion of responsibility have resulted
25 26	from the creation of a multiplicity of commissions and other entities involved with planning, projecting, evaluating, approving, operating, or otherwise affecting transportation in Northern Virginia. Therefore,
20 27	to the greatest extent practicable, it shall be the policy of the Commonwealth, to the greatest extent
28	practicable, to consolidate all regional functions, powers, duties, and responsibilities relating to
29	transportation in Northern Virginia in the Northern Virginia Transportation District and the
30	Consolidated Transportation Commission.
31	§ 2. Northern Virginia Transportation District Created.
32 33	For the purpose of taking advantage of the "Transportation District Act of 1964", there There is hereby created the Northern Virginia Transportation District in which shall function the Northern
33 34	Virginia Consolidated Transportation Commission, with Except as otherwise provided in this act, the
35	District shall have all of the powers granted by such law Chapter 45 (§ 15.2-4500 et seq.) of Title 15.2
36	of the Code of Virginia, and amendments thereof, and any other law, and subject to all of the provisions
37	thereof, and the district as created shall be deemed for any and all purposes to have been validly created
38	under said Act.
39	In carrying out its responsibilities under this act, the Commission shall be primarily mindful of the
40	best interest of the District at large and shall give full and equal consideration to the needs for,
41 42	interests of, and benefits to be derived from all modes of transportation, including but not limited to highway, rail, bus, and all forms of mass transit and mass transit facilities.
43	No other district shall be created under Chapter 45 (§ 15.2-4500 et seq.) of Title 15.2 within any
44	locality or localities embraced within the District.
45	§ 3. Northern Virginia Transportation District Described.
46	Subject to amendment as provided by the "Transportation District Act of 1964", or by other law, the
47	said The Northern Virginia Transportation District shall embrace the Counties of Arlington and, Fairfax,
48 49	Loudoun, Prince William, and Stafford and the Cities of Alexandria, Falls Church and Fairfax, Falls Church, Fredericksburg, Manassas, and Manassas Park.
5 0	§ 4. Members of the Consolidated Transportation Commission.
51	Pursuant to the provisions of Article 3, Section 3, of the "Transportation District Act of 1964," the
52	The members of the Northern Virginia Consolidated Transportation Commission shall consist of: five
53	members from Fairfax County; three from Arlington County; one from Loudoun County; four from
54	Prince William County; one from Stafford County; two from the city of Alexandria;; one from the city
55	of Falls Church;; one from the city of Fairfax; one from the city of Fredericksburg; one from the city of
56 57	Manassas; one from the city of Manassas Park; the member of the Commonwealth Transportation Board who resides in the Northern Virginia construction district: the Director of the Virginia
57 58	Board who resides in the Northern Virginia construction district; the Director of the Virginia Department of Rail and Public Transportation or his designee; and the Chairman of the State Highway
50	Department of Nuti and I abuse Transportation of his designee, and the Chanman of the State Highway

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59 and Commonwealth Transportation Board Commissioner or his designee; the one member of the National Capital Region Transportation Planning Board, chosen by the Board, who is a resident of 60 Virginia; and one member of the Board of Directors of the Washington Metropolitan Area Transportation Authority, chosen by the Board, who is a resident of Virginia. If a county or city 61 62 63 contiguous to the District agrees to join the District, such jurisdiction shall appoint one member to the

64 Commission. The members from the respective counties and cities shall be appointed by the governing 65 bodies of their county or city in the manner specified therein in § 15.2-4507 of the Code of Virginia.

In addition, the following members shall be appointed: 66

(a) three four members of the House of Delegates appointed by the Speaker of the House of 67 68 Delegates for terms of two years each;

(b) two three members of the Senate appointed by the Committee on Privileges and Elections of the 69 Senate for terms of four years each. 70

71 Only those members of the Commission representing the counties and cities embraced within the District and members of the House of Delegates and Senate shall be voting members, all other 72 73 Commission members may participate equally with voting members in all Commission activities, but 74 shall serve without a vote. The votes of Commission members representing counties and cities embraced 75 within the District shall be weighted so as to reflect the population of the localities those members 76 represent.

Members of the General Assembly may be eligible for reappointment so long as they remain 77 78 members of their respective houses.

79 All voting members, other than the Chairman of the State Highway and Transportation Board or his 80 designee, irrespective of the identity of the appointing authority shall be residents of the territory 81 comprising the District.

2. That § 5 of Chapter 630 of the Acts of Assembly of 1964 is repealed. 82

83 3. That on July 1, 2000, any and all transportation districts hitherto created under Chapter 45

(§ 15.2-4500 et seq.) of Title 15.2 of the Code of Virginia or under Chapter 32 (§ 15.1-1342 et seq.) 84 85 of Title 15.1 of the Code of Virginia are abolished, and their powers and duties are hereby transferred to and shall hereafter be vested in the Northern Virginia Transportation District, 86 87 created by Chapter 630, as amended, of the Acts of Assembly of 1964. On and after July 1, 2000, 88 no other transportation district shall be created under Chapter 45 (§ 15.2-4500 et seq.) of Title 89 15.2 of the Code of Virginia within any locality or localities embraced within the Northern 90 Virginia Transportation District. On and after July 1, 2000, all debts, assets, contracts, and 91 agreements issued, held or entered into by any transportation district abolished by this act shall be 92 deemed issued, held or entered into by the Northern Virginia Transportation District.

4. That on July 1, 2000, any and all transportation advisory committees and similar entities, 93 having responsibility for matters relating to transportation in Northern Virginia and created by 94

95 executive order of the Governor, are abolished. No other such transportation advisory committees or similar entities with responsibility for any matters relating to transportation in Northern 96 97

Virginia shall be established by executive order of the Governor.

98 5. That the provisions of this act shall become effective on July 1, 2000.
