8	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
9	1. That § 8.01-293 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
10	§ 8.01-293. Who to serve process.
11	A. The following persons are authorized to serve process:
12	1. The sheriff within such territorial bounds as described in § 8.01-295; or
13	2. Any person of age eighteen years or older and who is not a party or otherwise interested in the
14 15	subject matter in controversy. Whenever in this Code the term "officer" or "sheriff" is used to refer to persons authorized to make,
15 16	return or do any other act relating to service of process, such term shall be deemed to refer to any
17	person authorized by this section to serve process.
18	B. Notwithstanding any other provision of law (i) only a sheriff may execute an order or writ of
19	possession for personal, real or mixed property, including an order or writ of possession arising out of
20	an action in unlawful entry and detainer or ejectment; (ii) any sheriff or law-enforcement officer as
21	defined in § 9-169 of the Code of Virginia may serve any capias or criminal show cause order; and (iii)
$\overline{22}$	only a sheriff, the high constable for the City of Norfolk or Virginia Beach or a treasurer may levy
23	upon property.
24	C. Any person who is not a law-enforcement officer shall not be authorized by this section to serve
25	process, unless such person has completed training as prescribed by the Department of Criminal Justice
26	Services. The Department shall promulgate regulations and minimal standards for training of such
27	process servers.
28	D. No person who has been convicted of a felony and whose rights are unrestored shall be
29	authorized by this section to serve process. Any person applying to the Department of Criminal Justice
30	Services for authorization to serve process shall consent in writing, on a form to be provided by the
31	Department, to have the Department obtain his criminal history record information.
