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VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

An Act to amend and reenact § 53.1-183 of the Code of Virginia, relating to membership on community criminal justice boards.

6 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

7 1. That § 53.1-183 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:

8 § 53.1-183. Community criminal justice boards.

9 Each county or city or combination thereof developing and establishing a local pretrial services or a community-based probation program pursuant to the provisions of this article shall establish a community criminal justice board. Each county and city participating in a local pretrial or 10 11 12 community-based probation program shall be represented on the community criminal justice board. In 13 the event that one county or city appropriates funds to the program as part of a multijurisdictional effort, 14 any other participating county or city shall be considered to be participating in a program if such 15 locality appropriates funds to the program. Appointments to the board shall be made by each local governing body. In cases of multijurisdictional participation, unless otherwise agreed upon, each 16 participating city or county shall have an equal number of appointments. Boards shall be composed of 17 the number of members established by resolution or ordinance of each participating jurisdiction. Each 18 19 board shall include, at a minimum, the following mandatory members: a member person from each 20 governing body or a city or county manager, county administrator or executive, or assistant or deputy 21 appointed by the each governing body to represent the governing body; a judge of the general district 22 court; a circuit court judge; a juvenile and domestic relations district court judge; a chief magistrate; one 23 chief of police or the sheriff in a jurisdiction not served by a police department to represent law enforcement; an attorney for the Commonwealth; a public defender, and/or an attorney who is 24 25 experienced in the defense of criminal matters; a sheriff or the regional jail administrator responsible for 26 jails serving those jurisdictions involved in the local pretrial services and community-based probation 27 program; a local educator; and a community services board administrator.
