10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That § 24.2-427 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 24.2-427. Cancellation of registration by voter or for persons known to be deceased or disqualified
13	to vote.
14 15	Any registered voter may cancel his registration and have his name removed from the central registration records by signing an authorization for cancellation and mailing or otherwise submitting the
15 16	signed authorization to the general registrar. When submitted by any means other than when notarized or
17	in person, such cancellation must be made at least twenty-nine days prior to an election in order to be
18	valid in that election. The general registrar shall acknowledge receipt of the authorization and advise the
19	voter in person or by first-class mail that his registration has been canceled within ten days of receipt of
20	such authorization.
21	The general registrar shall cancel the registration of (i) all persons known by him to be deceased or
22	disqualified to vote by reason of a felony conviction or adjudication of incapacity and (ii) all persons for
23	whom a notice has been received, signed by the voter or the registration official of another jurisdiction
24	or for whom a notice has been submitted to the Department of Motor Vehicles in accordance with the
25	Driver License Compact set out in Article 18 of Chapter 3 of Title 46.2 (§ 46.2-483 et seq.) and
26	forwarded to the general registrar that the voter has moved from the Commonwealth. The notice

forwarded to the general registrar, that the voter has moved from the Commonwealth. The notice received in clause (ii) shall be considered as a written request from the voter to have his registration cancelled. A voter's registration may be cancelled at any time during the year in which the general registrar discovers that the person is no longer entitled to be registered.
