Continuing the Virginia-Maryland-District of Columbia Joint Legislative Commission on Interstate Transportation.

10 WHEREAS, House Joint Resolution No. 154 established a joint legislative commission on Interstate Transportation to meet with legislators from the State of Maryland and representatives of the District of 11 Columbia to advise the General Assembly and the Governor on efforts to address interstate 12 transportation issues in the Metropolitan Washington Region; and 13

WHEREAS, the considerable size of this panel, the unprecedented nature of its mandate, the 14 sensitivity and complexity of the many challenges involved, and the very considerable cost associated 15 with virtually every attempt to meet those challenges have all combined to make the work of the 16 Commission very time consuming; and 17

WHEREAS, the Commission was, in fact, able to conduct only two meetings in the course of 2000, 18 19 one of them an introductory and organizational meeting and the other a fact-finding tour combined with 20 planning for future meetings; and

21 WHEREAS, however cumbersome and time-consuming this process may be, the need for 22 inter-jurisdictional dialogue aimed at comprehensive, creative, region-wide solutions to the area's many 23 and vexing transportation difficulties is so urgent, and the possible benefits from such interjurisdictional 24 cooperation are so valuable that a long-term commitment by the Commonwealth to the process is amply 25 justified; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Virginia-Maryland-District 26 27 of Columbia Joint Legislative Commission on Interstate Transportation be continued for an additional 28 two years. The members appointed pursuant to Joint Resolution No. 154 of the 2000 Session shall 29 continue to serve, with any vacancy being filled in the same manner as the original appointment. All 30 agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Commission upon request. 31

The direct costs of this study shall not exceed \$25,000 for these two additional years.

The Commission shall complete its work in time to submit its findings and recommendations to the 32 33 Governor and the 2003 Session of the General Assembly as provided in the procedures of the Division 34 of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents.

35 Implementation of this resolution is subject to subsequent approval and certification by the Joint 36 Rules Committee. The Committee may withhold expenditures or delay the period for the conduct of the 37 study.

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
