WHEREAS, representatives of the community of Reston have worked together in a Reston 2000 Task Force to identify goals for the community in many areas including transportation; and

WHEREAS, a committee working under the direction of the Secretary of Transportation as requested in HJR 542 (1999) developed short-term and long-term transportation improvements affecting the Reston area; and

WHEREAS, the Dulles Corridor Task Force has developed a four-phase plan for extending rail service from Falls Church through Reston to Dulles Airport; and

WHEREAS, Reston continues to grow as a major center of business, commercial, and residential activity with its 15.3 million square feet of commercial space being the second greatest concentration in the Commonwealth: and

WHEREAS, there continues to be a need for coordinating the transportation improvements for the Reston community; and

WHEREAS, under Senate Joint Resolution No. 193 and House Joint Resolution No. 166 considerable strides have been made toward addressing Reston's many and intractable transportation difficulties, but much more needs urgently to be done; now, therefore, be it
