014359756 **HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 671** 1 2 AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE 3 (Proposed by the House Committee on Rules 4 5 6 7 on February 4, 2001) (Patron Prior to Substitute—Delegate Hall) Establishing the Commission on Growth and Economic Development. WHEREAS, the Commonwealth's healthy and productive economy has resulted in rapid growth in 8 many areas of the Commonwealth; and 9 WHEREAS, growth has helped fuel the creation of jobs and wealth in such areas; and 10 WHEREAS, rapid growth also impacts many other issues such as housing availability, transportation, 11 education, public utilities, public safety, human services, and loss of agricultural resources and open 12 space: and WHEREAS, patterns of business and residential development have changed over time and will 13 14 undoubtedly continue to change in this age of rapid technological advancements; and WHEREAS, the Commonwealth and its localities are challenged to develop strategies to promote sensible growth, reduce congestion, preserve open space, provide infrastructure in a timely manner as needed, and assure Virginians that they have the ability to work, live, and play in a healthy environment; and WHEREAS, the complexity of the many issues related to the Commonwealth's growth and economic 19 20 development can not be adequately addressed in a piecemeal legislative fashion, but rather demand a 21 comprehensive, deliberate approach involving both state and local elected officials; and 22 WHEREAS, such a comprehensive, deliberate approach may also benefit from the use of professional 23 facilitation as a method to resolve issues arising from growth and economic development; now, 24 therefore, be it 25 RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That a commission be established to 26 study growth and economic development. The Commission shall consist of 14 members, which shall 27 include eight legislative members and six nonlegislative members as follows: five members of the House 28 of Delegates, to be appointed by the Speaker of the House in accordance with the principles of 29 proportional representation contained in the Rules of the House of Delegates; three members of the 30 Senate, to be appointed by the Senate Committee on Privileges and Elections; four citizen members, of whom two shall be members of local governing bodies to be appointed by the Speaker; and two citizen 31 32 members, of whom one shall be a member of a local governing body to be appointed by the Senate Committee on Privileges and Elections. Persons interested in the study may make recommendations to 33 34 the Speaker of the House and the Senate Committee on Privileges and Elections regarding citizen 35 appointments. 36 In conducting its study, the commission shall encourage the participation of all interested groups, 37 organizations and individuals, including those associated with business interests, the development 38 community, and environmental causes. In examining issues related to growth and economic 39 development, the commission shall exclusively examine: 40 1. The adequacy of current revenue resources to meet existing and future infrastructure needs. During 41 the course of this examination, the commission should consider the recommendations of the Commission 42 on Virginia's State and Local Tax Structure for the 21st Century; 2. The revitalization of inner-city areas and older suburbs in order to make more efficient use of 43 44 existing infrastructure and improve the quality of life for many Virginians; 3. The development of abandoned or unused sites (brownfields) in order to enhance the economic 45 vitality of communities in which they are located; and 46 47 4. The appropriate means of preserving both open space and individual property rights as well as **48** broad-based funding mechanisms for accomplishing preservation goals. 49 The Commission may also utilize the services of a professional facilitation service during the course 50 of its work. 51 The direct costs of this study shall not exceed \$8,800. The Division of Legislative Services shall provide staff support for the study. The Department of 52 53 Housing and Community Development shall provide technical support for the study. 54 All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the commission, upon request. The commission shall complete its work in time to submit its written findings and recommendations 55 by November 30, 2001, to the Governor and the 2002 Session of the General Assembly as provided in 56 the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative 57 58 documents.
