014418756 **HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 671** 1 2 AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE 3 (Proposed by the Joint Conference Committee 4 5 6 7 on February 24, 2001) (Patron Prior to Substitute—Delegate Hall) Establishing the Commission on Growth and Economic Development. WHEREAS, the Commonwealth's healthy and productive economy has resulted in rapid growth in 8 many areas of Virginia; and 9 WHEREAS, growth has helped fuel the creation of jobs and wealth in such areas; and 10 WHEREAS, rapid growth also impacts many other issues such as housing availability, transportation, 11 education, public utilities, public safety, human services, and loss of agricultural resources and open 12 space: and 13 WHEREAS, patterns of business and residential development have changed over time and will 14 undoubtedly continue to change in this age of rapid technological advancements; and 15 WHEREAS, the Commonwealth and its localities are challenged to develop strategies to promote 16 sensible growth, reduce congestion, preserve open space, provide infrastructure in a timely manner as 17 needed, and assure Virginians that they have the ability to work, live, and play in a healthy 18 environment: and 19 WHEREAS, the complexity of the many issues related to the Commonwealth's growth and economic 20 development can not be adequately addressed in a piecemeal legislative fashion, but rather demand a 21 comprehensive, deliberate approach involving both state and local elected officials; and 22 WHEREAS, such a comprehensive, deliberate approach may also benefit from the use of professional 23 facilitation as a method to resolve issues arising from growth and economic development; now, 24 therefore, be it 25 RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That a commission be established to study growth and economic development. The Commission shall consist of eight members, which shall 26 27 include six legislative members and two nonlegislative members as follows: four members of the House 28 of Delegates, to be appointed by the Speaker of the House in accordance with the principles of 29 proportional representation contained in the Rules of the House of Delegates; two members of the 30 Senate, to be appointed by the Senate Committee on Privileges and Elections; one citizen member appointed by the Speaker of the House; and one citizen member appointed by the Senate Committee on 31 32 Privileges and Elections. Persons interested in the study may make recommendations to the Speaker of the House and the Senate Committee on Privileges and Elections regarding citizen appointments. 33 34 In conducting its study, the commission shall encourage the participation of all interested groups, 35 organizations and individuals, including those associated with local governments, business interests, the development community, and environmental causes. All interested parties shall submit any written recommendations or findings for the Commission's consideration by September 1, 2001. In examining 36 37 38 issues related to growth and economic development, the commission shall exclusively examine: 39 1. The adequacy of current revenue resources to meet existing and future infrastructure needs. During 40 the course of this examination, the commission should consider the recommendations of the Commission 41 on Virginia's State and Local Tax Structure for the 21st Century; 42 2. The revitalization of inner-city areas and older suburbs in order to make more efficient use of existing infrastructure and improve the quality of life for many Virginians; 43 44 3. The development of abandoned or unused sites (brownfields) in order to enhance the economic 45 vitality of communities in which they are located; and 4. The appropriate means of preserving both open space and individual property rights as well as 46 47 broad-based funding mechanisms for accomplishing preservation goals. **48** The Commission may also utilize the services of a professional facilitation service during the course 49 of its work. 50 The direct costs of this study shall not exceed \$8,500. 51 The Division of Legislative Services shall provide staff support for the study. The Department of Housing and Community Development shall provide technical support for the study. 52 53 All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the commission, upon request. 54 The commission shall complete its work in time to submit its written findings and recommendations by November 30, 2001, to the Governor and the 2002 Session of the General Assembly as provided in 55 the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative 56 57 documents. Implementation of this resolution is subject to subsequent approval and certification by the Joint 58 59 Rules Committee. The Committee may withhold expenditures or delay the period for the conduct of the
