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9	WHEREAS, forestry embraces the science, art and practice of creating, managing, using and
10	conserving forests and associated resources for human benefit and in a sustainable manner to meet
11	desired goals, needs and values; and
12	WHEREAS, forest management involves the practical application of biological, physical, quantitative,
13 14	managerial, economic, social and policy principles to the regeneration, management, utilization and
14	conservation of forests to meet specified goals and objectives while maintaining the productivity of the forest including management for aesthetics, fish, recreation, urban values, water, wilderness, wildlife,
16	wood products and other forest resource values; and
17	WHEREAS, foresters render services to landowners that require knowledge of the principles of
18	forestry and forest management; and
19	WHEREAS, these services include consultation, investigation, evaluation, planning and other
20	activities that contribute to the visual character and environmental health and quality of the
21	Commonwealth and the convenience and enjoyment of its citizens; and
22	WHEREAS, in certain instances, the improper provision of forestry services by foresters may present
23	the threat of irreparable damage to property and the health of the environment; and
24 25	WHEREAS, currently foresters are not regulated; and
25	WHEREAS, the absence of any regulation may not adequately protect the citizens of the
26	Commonwealth from unqualified persons practicing forestry; and
27	WHEREAS, the Board for Professional and Occupational Regulation is authorized by § 54.1-310 of
28 29	the Code of Virginia to evaluate professions and occupations for consideration of whether such
29 30	professions and occupations should be regulated, and to make recommendations as the public interest requires to the General Assembly concerning such regulation; now, therefore, he it
30 31	requires to the General Assembly concerning such regulation; now, therefore, be it RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Board for Professional and
32	Occupational Regulation be requested to evaluate the need for and recommend the degree of regulation

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of foresters, if any, in the Commonwealth. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Board for this study, upon request. The Board shall complete its work in time to submit its findings and recommendations to the Governor and the 2002 Session of the General Assembly as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents. 34 35 36 37
