3	(Proposed by the Senate Committee on Education and Health

6	A BILL to require a study of the duties and responsibilities of local health departments to assist special
7	populations during emergencies and disasters.
8	Whereas, emergency situations and disasters occur in spite of extensive efforts to prevent and avoid
9	them; and
10	Whereas, planning, training, and coordination of services help reduce the loss of life and property;
11	and
12	Whereas, special populations, such as the elderly and the disabled, may require specific services from
13	government during its response to an emergency situation or disaster; and
14	Whereas, because many of these special populations are served through agencies within the
15	Secretariat of Health and Human Resources, and the special assistance that such persons may require
16	should be coordinated to ensure the prompt delivery of necessary services and to maximize efficiency;
17	and
18	Whereas, the Department of Emergency Management has the statutory responsibility to "prepare and
19	maintain a State Emergency Operations Plan for disaster response and recovery operations," and each
20 21	locality "shall be responsible for local disaster mitigation, preparedness, response, and recovery," with
<sup>21</sup> 22	the assistance of the Department of Emergency Management; and Whereas, it is important to the health and welfare of all citizens, especially special populations,

2 <del>7</del> 25	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
<b>2</b> 6	1. That the Secretary of Health and Human Resources, in consultation with the Department of
20 27	<i>Emergency Management, shall study the duties and responsibilities of local health departments to assist</i>
28	special populations during emergencies and disasters. In conducting the study, the Secretary shall,
29	among other things, (i) assess the adequacy of state and local emergency management plans and
30	preparedness to manage special populations during emergency situations and disasters; (ii) determine
31	the availability of caregivers, shelters, facilities, and resources required to serve elderly or disabled
32	citizens who are not mobile or who depend on life support systems; and (iii) suggest ways to correct
33	any identified deficiencies. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Secretary
34	of Health and Human Resources for this study, upon request.
35	The Secretary of Health and Human Resources shall complete his work in time to submit his written
36	findings and recommendations by November 15, 2001, to the Governor and the 2002 Session of the
37	General Assembly as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for
38	the processing of legislative documents.

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
