That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 24.2-703.1, as follows: § 24.2-703.1. Permanent application for absentee ballots for certain ill or disabled voters. Any person who is unable to vote at the polls because of a permanent illness or physical disability shall be eligible to file a single application to receive ballots for all elections in which he is eligible to vote. His application shall be accompanied by a statement, on a form prescribed by the State Board and signed by the voter and his physician or accredited religious practitioner, that the voter is unable to vote at the polls because of a permanent illness or physical disability. In accordance with procedures established by the State Board, the general registrar shall retain the application and form, enroll the applicant on a permanent absentee voter applicant list, and process the applicant's request for an absentee ballot for each succeeding election.
