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VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

2 An Act to amend and reenact §§ 22.1-23 and 51.1-155 of the Code of Virginia, relating to retirement 3 allowance for teachers.

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Approved

- Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
- 1. That §§ 22.1-23 and 51.1-155 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as follows: § 22.1-23. Duties in general.
 - The Superintendent of Public Instruction shall:
 - 1. Serve as secretary of the Board of Education;
- 11 2. Provide such assistance in his office as shall be necessary for the proper and uniform enforcement 12 of the provisions of the school laws in cooperation with the local school authorities;
- 13 3. Prepare and furnish such forms for attendance officers, teachers and other school officials as are 14 required by law;
- 15 4. At least annually, survey all local school divisions to identify critical shortages of teachers and 16 administrative personnel by geographic area, by school division, or by subject matter, and report such critical shortages to each local school division and to the Virginia Retirement System; and 17
 - 5. Perform such other duties as the Board of Education may prescribe.
 - § 51.1-155. Service retirement allowance.

20 A. Retirement allowance. - A member shall receive an annual retirement allowance, payable for life, 21 as follows:

22 1. Normal retirement. - The allowance shall equal 1.70 percent of his average final compensation 23 multiplied by the amount of his creditable service.

24 2. Early retirement; applicable to teachers, state employees, and certain others. - The allowance shall 25 be determined in the same manner as for normal retirement with creditable service and average final 26 compensation being determined as of the date of actual retirement. If the member has less than thirty 27 years of service at retirement, the amount of the retirement allowance shall be reduced on an actuarial 28 equivalent basis for the period by which the actual retirement date precedes the earlier of (i) his normal 29 retirement date or (ii) the first date on which he would have completed a total of thirty years of 30 creditable service. The provisions of this subdivision shall apply to teachers and state employees. These 31 provisions shall also apply to employees of any political subdivision that participates in the retirement 32 system if the political subdivision makes the election provided in subdivision 3 of this subsection.

3. Early retirement; applicable to employees of certain political subdivisions. - The allowance shall 33 34 be determined in the same manner as for normal retirement with creditable service and average final compensation being determined as of the date of actual retirement. If the creditable service of the 35 member equals thirty or more years but the sum of his age at retirement plus his creditable service at 36 37 retirement is less than ninety, the amount of the retirement allowance shall be reduced on an actuarial 38 equivalent basis for the period by which the actual retirement date precedes the earlier of (i) his normal 39 retirement date or (ii) the first date on which the sum of his then attained age plus his then creditable 40 service would have been equal to ninety or more had he remained in service until such date. If the 41 member has less than thirty years of creditable service, the retirement allowance shall be reduced for the 42 period by which the actual retirement date precedes the earlier of (i) his normal retirement date or (ii) 43 the first date on which he would have completed a total of at least thirty years of creditable service and 44 his then creditable service plus his then attained age would have been equal to ninety or more.

45 The provisions of this subdivision shall apply to the employees of any political subdivision that participates in the retirement system. The participating political subdivision may, however, elect to 46 provide its employees with the early retirement allowance set forth in subdivision 2 of this subsection. 47 48 Any election pursuant to this subdivision shall be set forth in a legally adopted resolution.

4. Additional allowance. - In addition to the allowance payable under subdivisions 1, 2, and 3 of this 49 50 subsection, a member shall receive an additional allowance which shall be the actuarial equivalent, for his attained age at the time of retirement, of the excess of his accumulated contributions transferred from 51 the abolished system to the retirement system, including interest credited at the rate of two percent 52 53 compounded annually since the transfer to the date of retirement, over the annual amounts equal to four 54 percent of his annual creditable compensation at the date of abolishment for a period equal to his period 55 of membership in the abolished system.

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5. 50/10 retirement. - The allowance shall be payable in a monthly stream of payments equal to the

greater of (i) the actuarial equivalent of the benefit the member would have received had he terminated
service and deferred retirement to age fifty-five or (ii) the actuarially calculated present value of the
member's accumulated contributions, including accrued interest.

60 B. Beneficiary serving in position covered by this title.

1. Except as provided in subdivision subdivisions 2 and 3, if a beneficiary of a service retirement
allowance under this chapter is at any time in service as an employee in a position covered for
retirement purposes under the provisions of this or any chapter other than Chapter 7 (§ 51.1-700 et seq.)
of this title, his retirement allowance shall cease while so employed. Any member who retires and later
returns to covered employment shall not be entitled to select a different retirement option for a subsequent retirement.

67 2. Active members of the General Assembly who are eligible to receive a retirement allowance under 68 this title, excluding their service as a member of the General Assembly, shall be eligible to receive a retirement allowance based on their creditable service and average final compensation for service other 69 than as a member of the General Assembly. Such members of the General Assembly shall continue to 70 71 be reported as any other members of the retirement system. Upon ceasing to serve in the General 72 Assembly, members of the General Assembly receiving a retirement allowance based on their creditable 73 service and average final compensation for service other than as a member of the General Assembly 74 shall have their retirement allowance recomputed prospectively to include their service as a member of 75 the General Assembly. Active members of the General Assembly shall be prohibited from receiving a 76 service retirement allowance under this title based solely on their service as a member of the General 77 Assembly.

78 3. Any person receiving a service retirement allowance under this chapter, who is hired as a local
79 school board instructional or administrative employee required to be licensed by the Board of
80 Education, may elect to continue to receive the retirement allowance during such employment, under the
81 following conditions:

82 (a) The person's retirement allowance is based in whole or in part on service as a local school
83 board instructional or administrative employee required to be licensed by the Board of Education;

(b) The person has been receiving such retirement allowance for a certain period of time preceding
 his employment as provided by law;

(c) The person is not receiving a retirement benefit pursuant to an early retirement incentive
 program from any local school division within the Commonwealth; and

(d) At the time the person is employed, the position to which he is assigned is among those identified by the Superintendent of Public Instruction pursuant to subdivision 4 of § 22.1-23.

90 If the person elects to continue to receive the retirement allowance during the period of such employment, then his service performed and compensation received during such period of time will not increase, decrease, or affect in any way his retirement benefits before, during, or after such employment.
93 2. That the Board and the Joint Legislative and Audit Review Commission shall jointly determine the period of time preceding employment, required pursuant to subdivision B 3 (b) of § 51.1-155, that will result in there being no negative fiscal impact to the Commonwealth pursuant to the provisions of this act. Such determination shall be made in consultation with the actuary of the

97 Retirement System, the actuary of the Joint Legislative and Audit Review Commission, the 98 Superintendent of Public Instruction, and the chairmen of the Senate Committee on Finance and 99 the House Committee on Appropriations. The period of time determined shall be consistent with the federal tax qualification of the plan. The Board may adopt such jointly determined period of 100 time for purposes of providing for a person to continue to receive his retirement allowance while 101 102 employed as a local school board instructional or administrative employee required to be licensed by the Board of Education and pursuant to all other elections or conditions of this act. Only if 103 104 such person has been retired for such jointly determined period of time shall such person be 105 permitted to elect to continue to receive his retirement allowance while employed as a local school board instructional or administrative employee as provided under this act, unless the general 106 107 appropriation act in effect at that time provides or authorizes a period of time such person shall

108 be retired that is less than such jointly determined period of time.

109 3. That the Virginia Retirement System, in consultation with the Superintendent of Public 110 Instruction, shall promulgate all reasonable and necessary policies and procedures to carry out the 111 provisions of this act relating to § 51.1-155.

- 112 4. That an emergency exists and this act is in force from its passage.
- 113 5. That the provisions of this act shall expire on July 1, 2006.
