004134480 **SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 211** 1 2 Offered January 24, 2000 3 Establishing a select committee to study the feasibility of establishing the Virginia Legislative Internship 4 Program. 5 Patron-Miller, Y.B. 6 7 Referred to Committee on Rules 8 9 WHEREAS, more and more students are finding out that applied learning, such as internships, gives them the necessary practical experience and provides a contact base that is invaluable in the job search 10 11 process; and WHEREAS, for employers, these programs allow them to get a jump-start on training a talented 12 13 young workforce; and 14 WHEREAS, government interns can engage in a variety of substantive endeavors, from preparing legislative and legal research, to organizing agenda and activities of meetings, to writing policy papers 15 16 and press releases, to designing webpages; and WHEREAS, internships encourage students to participate in challenges and rewards of public interest 17 work while providing the public interest community with the dedication, energy, and idealism that 18 19 interns bring to their work; and 20 WHEREAS, while some legislative agencies in Virginia have developed agency-specific internship 21 programs, there is no legislative branch-coordinated and funded internship program; and 22 WHEREAS, a legislative sponsored internship program will help prepare students for effective 23 participation in civic affairs, careers in government and the teaching of government, and graduate study 24 in political science, law, and other fields related to the public sector; now therefore, be it 25 RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That a select committee be established to study the feasibility of establishing the Virginia Legislative Internship Program. The select 26 27 committee shall be composed of 11 members as follows: two members of the Joint Rules Committee, to be appointed by the Chairman, one of whom shall be a member of the Senate and one of whom shall be 28 29 a member of the House of Delegates; three members of the Senate, to be appointed by the Senate 30 Committee on Privileges and Elections; four members of the House of Delegates, to be appointed by the 31 Speaker of the House; and the Chairman of the Senate Committee on Rules and the Chairman of the House Committee on Rules, who shall serve ex officio with full voting privileges. 32 33 In conducting its study, the select committee shall examine the organization and cost of the 34 internship program, including, but not limited to, the selection process, participation requirements, 35 performance evaluation, and potential sources of funding. 36 The direct costs of this study shall not exceed \$13,750. 37 The Division of Legislative Services shall provide staff support for the study. All agencies of the 38 Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the select committee, upon request. 39 The select committee shall complete its work in time to submit its findings and recommendations to 40 the Governor and the 2001 Session of the General Assembly as provided in the procedures of the 41 Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents. Implementation of this resolution is subject to subsequent approval and certification by the Joint 42 Rules Committee. The Committee may withhold expenditures or delay the period for the conduct of the 43 44 study.
