On the death of Richard J. Holland.

WHEREAS, Richard J. Holland of Windsor, a senior member of the Senate of Virginia, died on April 16, 2000; and

WHEREAS, a native of Windsor, Richard Holland was a graduate of Windsor High School, the 9 University of Virginia, and the Stonier Graduate School of Banking at Rutgers University and served his 10 nation as a naval officer in the South Pacific during World War II; and 11

WHEREAS, associated with Farmers Bank in Windsor for nearly a half-century, Richard Holland 12 13 was a small-town banker who took an active interest in the lives of his neighbors, many of whom relied 14 on his help to finance their cars, homes, businesses, and children's educations; and

WHEREAS, Richard Holland served on the Windsor Town Council for 22 years, then was elected 15 from the 15th Senatorial District in 1979 and began his long and distinguished career in the Senate of 16 Virginia: and 17

18 WHEREAS, popular and respected on both sides of the aisle, Senator Richard Holland represented 19 the citizens of the 15th District with characteristic determination, tenacity, integrity, and compassion; and

20 WHEREAS, as chairman of the Senate Rules Committee and a member of the Senate Finance 21 Committee, Senator Holland wielded his substantial influence judiciously and with a deep appreciation 22 for the best interests of his constituents and the Commonwealth; and

23 WHEREAS, in addition to his political and banking careers, Richard Holland served in leadership 24 positions on countless boards and commissions, including the board of visitors of Radford University, 25 the Virginia Bankers Association, the Virginia War Memorial Foundation, and the Jamestown-Yorktown 26 Foundation: and

27 WHEREAS, in the closing days of the 2000 General Assembly Session, Senator Richard Holland 28 returned from a serious illness and, with typical determination, sponsored a budget amendment to help 29 the City of Franklin recover from the ravages of Hurricane Floyd: and 30

WHEREAS, a man of wit, dedication, and a strong sense of loyalty, Richard Holland leaves a matchless legacy of service to his constituents, the Commonwealth, and the nation; now, therefore, be it

32 RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the General Assembly hereby 33 note with great sadness the passing of an uncommonly skilled, passionate, and effective legislator, 34 Senator Richard J. Holland; and, be it

RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the Senate prepare a copy of this resolution for 35 presentation to the family of Senator Richard J. Holland as an expression of the General Assembly's 36 37 deep appreciation and esteem for his life of service to the citizens of the Commonwealth of Virginia.
