22	housing components to make affordable housing more feasible; and
23	WHEREAS, completed, comparably priced site-built, modular and manufactured homes are
24	indistinguishable from one another due to advances in design technology; and
25	WHEREAS, manufactured housing inspection and construction systems have demonstrated that cost
26	can be reduced while housing value is enhanced; and
