9	WITEDEAS the Commence of the order the Community of the second se
10	WHEREAS, the Commonwealth and the General Assembly recognize and acknowledge the
11 12	contributions of veterans to our democratic system and to the freedoms we all enjoy; and
12 13	WHEREAS, retired veterans, those aged 65 and older, served during foreign crises of the 20th century at such places as the Ardennes, Kasserine Pass, Guadalcanal, Tarawa, Normandy, Bastogne,
13 14	Anzio, and Iwo Jima; and
15	WHEREAS, they also served during the Korean War at Inchon and the Chosin Reservoir, and in
16	Vietnam at DaNang, Khe Sanh, and Quang Tri; and
17	WHEREAS, these retired veterans now constitute a significant portion of the senior population of the
18	United States and, in particular, of Virginia; and
19	WHEREAS, the retired veterans were guaranteed through contract, both stated and implied, lifetime
20	access to medical benefits for themselves and their immediate family members upon retirement from the
21	armed services with 20 years or more of service; and
22	WHEREAS, prior to their own retirement at age 65, these veterans were provided health care
23	through the military health care system or through other U.S. Department of Defense programs; and
24	WHEREAS, through recent federal regulatory changes in entitlements for military health care
25	benefits, these older veterans and their family members have lost significant portions of their health care
26 27	support system; and WHEPEAS the medical hanafite, which were last through changes to federal logislation, forged these
27 28	WHEREAS, the medical benefits, which were lost through changes to federal legislation, forced these veterans to pay out-of-pocket for medical coverage from alternative sources and to join omnibus national
20 29	health programs, such as Medicare; and
30	WHEREAS, many veteran retirees and their immediate families live on fixed incomes, and the loss
31	of medical benefits significantly impacts their quality of life, disrupts their needed levels of care, and
32	puts out of reach certain health care benefits and pharmaceutical support to which they had previously
33	been entitled; and
34	WHEREAS, many of these veteran retirees, still suffering from service-connected injuries and serious
35	illnesses, have found their access to medical treatment facilities limited by downsizing or, in some rural
36	areas, elimination of needed facilities; and
37	WHEREAS, these honorable men and women, who have served and sacrificed in the uniformed
38	service of this nation, are deserving of the health care programs that they were guaranteed when they
39 40	completed 20 years or more of service; and WHEPEAS, the Concrel Assembly, has a special shares to sefectuard and maintain the quality of life.
40 41	WHEREAS, the General Assembly has a special charge to safeguard and maintain the quality of life for its citizens who have served and earned retirement benefits from military service; now, therefore, be

43	RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the General Assembly hereby
44	urge the Congress to reinstate full medical benefits for those qualified veterans who have reached age 65
45	or over; and, be it
46	RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the Senate transmit copies of this resolution to the
47	President of the United States, the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, the President
48	of the United States Senate, and the members of the Virginia Congressional delegation so that they may
49	be apprised of the sense of the General Assembly of Virginia.
