**4. Title** Suspension of school employees.

5. Summary/Purpose: This bill provides that school employees who are placed on probation as first offenders for drug offenses are not entitled to any escrowed salary or reinstatement.

6. No Fiscal Impact: See #8.

7. Budget amendment necessary: No.

8. Fiscal implications: None this biennium. Depending on the hiring practices of local school boards on the issue of teacher replacement for suspended employees, this bill could marginally impact the calculation of the "prevailing average salary" which is used to determine the SOQ funding requirement. However, assuming that very few employees would be suspended, this impact most likely would be negligible.

9. Specific agency or political subdivisions affected: school divisions.

11. Other comments: SB1032 is the companion bill.
