4. Title Voluntary remediation of contaminated properties

- 5. Summary/Purpose: The bill would eliminate the requirement that local governments pay registration fees when voluntarily remediating their properties. The bill also would create the Virginia Voluntary Remediation Fund, which would provide grants to local governments for the voluntary remediation of contaminated properties. The bill as engrossed by the House would not become effective unless an appropriation effectuating its purposes is included in an appropriation act up through the 2004 Appropriation Act, passed by the General Assembly, and signed into law by the Governor.

- 8. Fiscal implications: There would likely be a minimal revenue loss to the Department of Environmental Quality associated with elimination of the requirement that local governments pay registration fees when voluntarily remediating their properties. Any additional fiscal impact associated with this legislation would depend on the amounts that may be appropriated to the Virginia Voluntary Remediation Fund and on the demand for grants from the Fund. While there would be additional costs to the Department of Environmental Quality associated with administration of the Fund, the amount of such costs is difficult to determine because it also would depend on the amounts appropriated to the Fund and on the demand for grants from the Fund.
