5. Summary/Purpose: This bill transfers certain responsibilities from the Department of Conservation and Recreation to the State Board of Elections regarding elections and candidates for directors of Soil and Water Conservation Districts.

8. Fiscal implications: None

9. Specific agency or political subdivisions affected: The Department of Conservation and Recreation, the State Board of Elections, and the city and county electoral boards.

10. Technical amendment necessary: Technical amendments have been offered by the State Board of Elections.

Other comments: The proposed amendments will enable and clarify that candidates must file required documents locally within the jurisdiction (county or city) of their residence, to qualify for the office of district director of a Soil and Water Conservation Districts. At this time, these documents are received by the Department of Conservation and Recreation and then are forwarded on to the State Board of Elections. The Department will continue to provide technical support in helping candidates prepare and submit these papers.
