5. **Summary/Purpose:** This bill transfers certain responsibilities from the Department of Conservation and Recreation to the State Board of Elections regarding elections and candidates for directors of Soil and Water Conservation Districts.

9. **Specific agency or political subdivisions affected:** The Department of Conservation and Recreation, the State Board of Elections, and city and county electoral boards.

11. **Other comments:** The proposed amendments will enable and clarify that candidates must file required documents locally within the jurisdiction (county or city) of their residence, to qualify for the office of district director of a Soil and Water Conservation District. At this time, these documents are received by the Department of Conservation and Recreation and then are forwarded on to the State Board of Elections. The Department of Conservation and Recreation will continue to provide technical support in helping candidates prepare and submit these papers.
