- 8. Fiscal implications: Since controlled substance registrations expire on December 31 of each year, most of the revenue from optometrists and nurse practitioners has been received for FY 2001-02, therefore, the fiscal impact of this bill would not occur until the FY 2001-02. There are currently 1,212 practitioners who would not have to be registered with the Board of Pharmacy for an annual loss of \$24,240 in revenue from a budget of \$1.8 million. Retention or loss of that revenue will not have a significant impact on the budget or on fees charged to other regulated entities (pharmacists and pharmacies). The Board may experience a modest decrease in expenditures by not having to issue and renew registrations, but the workload for those activities is limited and elimination will not result in the Board being able to eliminate an employee.
