4. **Title** Admittance and parking in state parks

5. **Summary/Purpose:** This bill authorizes the Department of Conservation and Recreation to assess a \$25 civil penalty to persons who enter or attempt to enter a state park without paying the fees for use of the park's facilities or park in prohibited areas of the park. The money paid in civil penalties is to be deposited into the Conservation Resources Fund.

7. **Budget amendment necessary:** No

8. **Fiscal implications:** The fiscal impact cannot be determined because the number of people who might violate the provisions of the bill is unknown. All civil penalties collected from the violation of these provisions will be deposited not into the Literary Fund but rather into the Conservation Resources Fund at the Department of Conservation and Recreation. The Conservation Resources Fund is used to conserve, develop, maintain, and operate state parks.
