**4. Title** Virginia Tobacco Settlement Fund; tobacco compliance checks

**5. Summary/Purpose:** This bill would ensure that the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control will receive money from the Virginia Tobacco Settlement Fund to conduct tobacco compliance checks as required of any state receiving settlement payments under the Master Settlement Agreement.

**8. Fiscal implications:** Currently the Virginia Tobacco Settlement Foundation receives ten percent of the annual amount derived from the Master Settlement Agreement (approximately \$14.7 million is anticipated for FY 2002). This bill would require the Virginia Tobacco Settlement Foundation to fund all tobacco compliance checks conducted by the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control. Based on historical expenditures, it is estimated that the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control expends approximately \$500,000 to conduct tobacco compliance checks each year.
